The largest sales of apple paper ever reported from this city occurred vesterday when a paper company of Seattle took orders for 10 cars of the small squares which are used to wrap apples before packing them for ed this fall, as only seven carloads were required last year. Two of the cars were sold to the horticultural union, which is compacted. union, which is composed of growers, while the remaining eight were sold to local dealers.

Each car contains approximately 30,000,000 of the paper squares of the usual dimensions of 10 by 10 inches. Each car costs in round numbers \$1200.

Orders were also taken for two cars of hop twine, which will be used in hop culture. This is the same amount used last year, but is much less than the amount used in 1904, when three and a half carloads were required.
