Among the Exchanges of the Inland Empire. Salmon Will Cost More. Opening prices on the 1907 pack of Columbia river salmon will shortly be announced by the Columbia River Packers' association, and there is every reason to believe that they will be higher than the opening prices last year. One of the lower river canners has already given out his prices for this season, which are as follows: Falls, \$1.60; flats, \$1.75; halves, \$1.05. In view of the trade, he has not upon the correct basis, and it is generally believed that the association's figures will be the same. Opening prices last year, which were maintained throughout the season were: Falls, \$1.55; flats, \$1.65; halves, \$1. The advance in prices is justified, according to the canners, by the heavy demand for chinook salmon and the fact that, whatever the pack size amount to, it cannot possibly be excessive. Fishing on the Columbia began today. The waters are not yet so muddy, and it will be several weeks before they can take hold. It is impossible, of course, to forecast the pack, but as the catch has run uniformly light in the past three years, which have been years of low water, and the indications this summer are for a higher river stage, it is hoped that the run of fish will be more plentiful. —The Dalles Chronicle. Freak Tree at Caldwell. One of nature's queer caprices is demonstrated in a tree on Charles Davis' lot near his handsome new residence, that is attracting considerable attention from passersby. The tree closely resembles a five or six-year peach in size and general appearance, also in the matter of foliage and bark. The bloom, however, refuses to bear out the peach theory, being exactly like that of the flowering almond shrub so common in old-fashioned gardens. The exact age of this curiosity is not known, but it is probably eight or ten years old. It is an unusually healthy growth requiring no spraying or other doctoring, and each spring presents a contradictory crop of pink flowering almond blooms, a variety so double as to resemble tiny June roses.—Caldwell News. Saturday evening as the train came down from Culdesac Conductor Dowling states a heavy flood of water was coming down the creek carrying logs and trees in the rush. Other small streams in the upper country are reported running bank full and some fears are entertained that considerable damage may result from the flood. The Clearwater and Snake rivers have been coming up steadily for the past few days and yesterday evening the former stream had reached a stage almost equal to the high water during the freshest last fall. Several families residing in small structures along the Clearwater slough were yesterday compelled to abandon their structures.
