Following is a complete text of the having care or charge of any land Oregon weed law which was passed at or lands, improved or unimproved, the last session of the legislature and which is now in force. The bill was drawn and introduced by Representative Barrett of this county, and if its provisions are enforced throughout the wheat districts will rid the county of the noxious weeds which now threaten to "take" the land in places. The county court and District Attorney G. W. Phelps will insist on the enforcement of the law and land owners and road supervisors are urged to co-operate with the officials in the enforcement. The law is as follows:

the State of Oregon: Section 1. It shall be the duty of lands in his road district, and the each road supervisor in each road county court shall audit and allow district in this state, in addition to the amount of expenses and just and he duties heretofore prescribed by reasonable charges of such work, as law, to ascertain from time to time other claims or bills filed by the road whether or not there is in his district any weed known as the Russian thistle, the Canada thistle, the Chisese thistle or Sisybrium Altissinum (called white mustard), cockle bur (known as the Dagger cockle bur) Atrisplex Argenty (called silver salt oush), and he shall as he ascertains that there is any of such weed and before any thereof has shed its bloom or commenced to form the seed, serve or cause to be served up-on the owner, if he be known, and residing within the county, and if not, upon the occupant of the premises upon which said weeds or thistles may be, a notice in writing notifving said owner or occupant of the existence of said thistle, weed or weeds, and in such notice shall give the name of such weed and a description of the land upon which same is growing. Said notice shall be served by delivering to the occupant or person in charge of said premises a copy thereof duly certified to be such by the person serving the same, and if there be no occupant of such land upon which such weed may be growing, then such no-tice shall be served by posting in three conspicuous places upon said premises a copy of such netice duly certified to be such by said roud supervisor.

2. Immediately Section serving said notice or posting same as provided in section 1, such road superviser shall file the criginal notice, a copy of which he has served as provided in section 1, with the county clerk of the county in which his district is situated, together with his return on said notice stating the time and manner of making such filed by the county clerk and retain-

ed as a record of his office. Section 3. If such owner or occupant shall fail or refuse for 16 days after being so notified of the exhis land, to completely remove same, it shall be the duty of such road supervisor and he shall have authorassistance such help as he may deem necessary, and cause said weed or weeds to be extirpated from said land in such a manner that will be most effective and work the least injury to the land, but that will destroy said weed and its seed and prevent the same from in any way spreading to any adjoining lands. Upon the completion of said work the road supervisor shall file with the county clerk an itemized statement of the expenses of destroying said weed including his own fees hereinafter provided, verified by his oath, and when said statement is filed, the county clerk shall cause the same to be entered upon a lien docket prepared for that purpose and the amount of said charges expenses when so docketed shall constitute a first lien, prior and superior to all other liens and charges upon said lands or premises, except taxes. If said charges and expenses are not paid, and said lien discharged, by the owner or occupant of said lands within six months after the same is docketed, it shall be the du-ty of the county clerk to notify in writing the district attorney of the district in which said county is situated of such fact, whose shall be to bring a suit in the name of the county for the foreclosure of said lien; and the lands affected thereby shall be sold under execution for the payment and satisfaction of said charges and expenses, and of said lien and all charges touching

the same. Section 4. If within 10 days after the statement has been filed and the lien docketed, as provided in the preceding section, no objections have been filed thereto, the county court shall pay the county supervisor out of the county funds, the amount of said charges and expenses, and the some shall be thereafter recovered to the use of the county, as in the fore-
