



claimed land in 2-20-15, Yakima dis-trict, on homestead entry, and Dulin set up a claim to it under the timber and stone act. The secretary of the interior uphoids the decision of the commissioner of the general land office in favor of Maccari's claim, contrary to the decision of the local oftice. The secretary is not satisfied with Dulin's testimony and points out that his witnesses are residents of North Yakima who testify on the strength of one or two visits made to the land in dispute, while Maccari's settlement on the land, building of a cabin and other improvement work. cannot be denied. The same decision, upholding that of the commissioner and reversing the decision of the local office, is made in the case of Pietro Bertoglio vs. Charles Barnes. The latter sought to make proof on timber land in 4-2-15, Yakima district, and the land is awarded to Bertoglio, a homesteader. Mr. Barnes is manager of the Boston Store.-Yakima Republic.

Three Lives Lost to Save One.

In an effort to rescue their co-laborers three loggers working on the Barber log drive at Krall's bar leaped into the swift current of the Boise river and were drowned, while the man to whose rescue they attempted to go was saved by his own efforts. The drowned are George Corack, an Australian, and Fernim Austabe and Francisco Vriondo, both Spaniards.

Many of the logs had plied up on the bar which is about four miles above the headgate of the New York canal, and the loggers, all of whon were experienced men, were working them off into the current of stream. The men had scarcely got warmed up to the work Monday morning when one of their number fell into the stream beside a log.

When he sunk out of sight five of the loggers jumped into the water to rescue him. Where the man fell the river is about 20 feet deep and very swift and turbulent. The loggers found that instead of being able assist their comrade a fierce battle for their own lives was facing them. They fought desperately and many times struggled to the surface from

log as he fell and after a short struggle, during which he passed under the log, pulled himself above the water and later succeeded in reaching the bank. Two of the others wesk and exhausted, also succeeded in reaching the bank.

The bodies have not been recovered.-Boise Statesman.

Stock in Idaho County, Idaho.

On Salmon river and its tributaries including Joseph and Doumeco Doumeco river range lying in this (Idaho) county, there are probably between 20,000 and 25,000 head, worth on the average, about \$20 per head. On Camas prairie, in the Tolo neighbor hood alone, there are over 2000 head and on the whole prairie and its Clearwater tributaries there are not less than 25,000 or 30,000 head, making a total of from 45,000 to 55,000 head of cattle, whose value will range between \$900,000 and \$1,100,000. The sheep industry of Idaho coun-y, on account of the homesteading of land, has declined' considerably during the last few years, but the must be between 12,000 and 15,000 sheep, with an average value of at least \$4 per head, making a total value of from \$48,000 to \$60,000. The number of horses is estimated at 30,

000, with an average value of \$75, making a total of \$2,250,000 for this industry. The number of hogs is thought to

he getween 12,000 and 15,000, with an average value of \$12 per hog, which would bring a total of from \$144,000 to \$160,000.

According to the lowest estimate the total value of stock in the coun-ty would be \$3,342,000 and by the highest estimate \$3,570,000 .- Lewiston Telle (Clearwater Corres.)






