NEW YORK LETTER

New York, April 4.—"Needles and pins, needles and pins, when a man's nursery days would be particularly appropriate, if sung to-day by the Madman of Matteawan, otherwise known as Harry Kendall Thaw. Three years ago today, on April 4, 1905, the young millionaire tied his blushing bride to the altar in the city of Pittsburgh. The anniversary can hardly be a source of pleasure to the distinguished prisoner of Matteawan, since the "blushing bride," who has good reason to blush, is now suing for an annulment of the marriage on the ground that he was a lunatic and of unsound mind. Considering subsequent revelations regarding the young woman, the charge of insanity at the time of the marriage is not lacking in feasibility.

Mr. Thaw does not lack for fellow sufferers in domestic infelicity. The troubles of Alfie Gynne Vanderbilt, the richest young man in America, and his beautiful wife, have for many days been subjects of popular comment. The divorce suit of the Hart McKees, tried in Paris, has added spice to the New York newspapers. The Duke of Abruzzi and Prince Ely de Shotgun, also have their troubles, in which the people of the metropolis have been mightily interested.

College Education.

Is a college or university education of any practical value in fighting the battles of life? There are many men in the "bread line" who will answer this question with a bitter, contemptuous negative. It is a strange but incontrovertible fact that many, perhaps even a majority, of the unfortunate who have been reduced to the necessity of "hitting the bread line" during the last winter have been men of more than ordinary educational attainments.

At one charitable organization on the East Side over 500 graduates or students of prominent universities applied for work. That employers doubt the practical usefulness of college men, even in the least important positions, is shown by the fact that in nearly every case the preference was given to applicants who did not give their educational acquirements as beyond the high school grade.

Close Famous Hotel.

As the hour of midnight approaches tonight, a mournful body of men will gather in the bar room of the Fifth Avenue Hotel and hold a wake over the remains of the famous hostelry that has been their home. When the clock strikes 12 the lights will go out, the doors will be locked and the shutters closed and the last guest will sadly wend his way to the street.

In a few days the work of demolition will commence, and a modern skyscraper office building will soon occupy the place where the hotel now stands. The last week has been one of deepest sorrow for the regular patrons, and the "amen corner" has become a place of grief and woe. A list of the great men who have passed through the portals of the famed hostelry would read very much like a dictionary of biography. Shortly after it was opened to the public in 1859, the Prince of Wales wrote his name on the register. During the civil war the Fifth Avenue hotel was the heart and center of New York's patriotism. In 1867, at the Peabody dinner, the movement for the nomination of Grant had its inception. Many years later, when the obsequies of that great leader of men were being held, the Fifth Avenue was the headquarters of the distinguished mourners.

In addition to the Prince of Wales, many other members of royal families have stopped at the hotel, among them Emperor Dom Pedro of Brazil, Crown Prince Uares of Spain, Prince Iturbide of Mexico, Prince Devonwase of Slam, the Marquis of Lorne, son-in-law of Queen Victoria, and many others.

Nearly all the presidents since the days of Lincoln have written their names across the registers of the hostelry. Hundreds of distinguished men and women in all walks of life, in addition to those named, have slept and dined within the walls that are now crumbling to ruin. The famous hostelry is to be a sacrifice to commerce, but its memory will live for many years in the hearts of those who have called it "home."

John D. Rockefeller, Jr., Has Plan to Promote "Big Brother" Idea.

New York, April 4.—A Bible class trust, with John D. Rockefeller, Jr., as its head, and which will include within its organization all the Bible classes in the country, is now being promoted by the young son of the Standard Oil magnate. The initial meeting of the new "trust" will be held this evening in the auditorium of the Fifth Avenue Baptist church, more familiarly known as the Rockefeller church. A large number of New York Bible classes will be represented at tonight's meeting, but this will be but a starter. Young Rockefeller hopes in time, to make the Rockefeller brand of Bible classes as well known and widely distributed as is his father's oil tanks.

In the opinion of John D. Jr., the salvation of the men of the future depends upon Bible classes more than upon the church. He is in favor of having every Bible class adopt the "big brother" plan of work, which has produced such successful results in the Rockefeller class. The plan is both simple and effective. A member of the class pledges himself to act as a big brother to one or more unfortunate young fellows whose environment is such as to prevent them rising from their sphere in life. The "big brother" has to advise, teach and help his charge in every manner possible. At the present time every young man turned out of the children's court is taken in charge of by a "big brother."

ELECTION DUE IN PORTUGAL.

To Select New Chamber to Succeed That of Franco, the Dictator.

Lisbon, April 4.—Portugal is on the eve of a general election for a new Chamber, to succeed the legislative body dissolved by Franco, the late dictator. The election will be held tomorrow and will be the first under the reign of King Manuel. The new Cortes will assemble on April 23. The administration has divided seats equally between the conservative and Liberal parties, with 20 personal friends of the premier holding the balance of power.

The arrangement naturally assures a government majority in any contingency, though the members of the premier's group are ostensibly without political affiliations. The people have the privilege of making nominations of their own, but Portuguese election methods insure a government victory unless there should be a popular uprising, amounting almost to a revolution.
