FREEWATER-MILTON

RAISING MONEY FOR REPAIRS TO RIVER BANK.

Another Market Day Is Being Planned for Freewater—Man Invests in Fine Alfalfa Ranch—Sales of Land Go on in This Section of County—Growth of Country Continues.

Freewater, April 4.—Money is rapidly being raised for the purpose of dyking the Walla Walla and Umatilla rivers to prevent danger from future floods. Petitions are in circulation asking the county court to give generous support in the undertaking, and nearly \$3000 has already been raised in subscriptions by the various ranchers. Work has already commenced on the banks of the river, and it will not be long until it is completed.

There will be another market day in Freewater April 11 if sufficient stock can be listed.

A. Dotson, of the Big Bend country has purchased 20 acres of alfalfa land of J. W. Emery, the consideration being \$1850, and 40 acres of Charles Rickard for \$150 per acre.

Bob Herndon has sold his ranch at Ferndale to Mrs. A. J. Crigler for \$9000.

GERMANS TO GROW BEETS.

Twenty-Five Families Will Emigrate From Walla Walla Valley to Union County.

La Grande, April 3.—Two men are here from the Walla Walla valley, looking over the sugar beet culture problem, with a view of ascertaining the conditions here, and in case they return with a favorable report, no less than 25 families from the Walla Walla valley, who are experienced gardeners, will come with the idea of growing beets.

The sugar company is taking special interest in showing them about the valley, and are desirous of securing these families to replace, as far as possible, the foreign imported labor. The latter are necessary under present conditions, but the company hopes that such will not always be the case.

COMMITTEES HAVE WORK OF REUNION UNDER WAY

Noted Young Pianist Will Appear at Normal Assembly Hall Tonight—Young Men Arranging for a Home Talent Play in Weston—Go on Sheep Shearing Trip.

Weston, April 4.—The Thirteenth annual reunion of the Umatilla county Pioneer association which will continue here May 28, 29 and 30, promises to be the biggest event of the kind held here for years. Dr. F. D. Hashbrouck has been elected chairman and Clark Wood has been elected secretary of the general committee. Different committees are now at work, and a meeting will be held April 13, when they will report the progress being made.

David B. Campbell of Monmouth will give a piano recital at the Normal assembly hall tonight. Mr. Campbell is a young man of remarkable musical genius and he promises to give a high class entertainment.

A few of the enterprising young men of Weston are arranging to present a home talent play, "The Borderland," in the city during the pioneers' reunion. A number of the young people here will take part in the play.

G. H. Sams, formerly of Freewater, has purchased the J. H. Clark quarter section of land on Dry creek for a consideration of \$6500. Mr. Sams will move his family here and take possession at once.

To Shear Sheep. J. H. Ridenous and James Harris will join the Hughes and Kearney crew of shearers and will begin the season with Herbert Bryson's flock at Le Grow siding. They will finish in Montana, where they have contracted to shear 50,000 head and later they will shear many thousand more head.

A teachers' institute for the teachers in this section of the county will be held here on April 25.

CALEDONIAN PICNIC.

Date Has Been Set and Much Interest Is Manifested.

Athens, April 4.—It has been decided by the members of the Umatilla Caledonian society to hold the annual Caledonian picnic at Athens on Friday and Saturday, May 22 and 23. Invitations will be sent out to other Caledonian societies throughout Oregon and eastern Washington, and reduced rates will be secured on the railroads.

This promises to be better than all former picnics given here. Saturday, May 23, the last day of the picnic, will end with a general political rally and candidates will be given a chance to meet the crowds of voters in this section of Oregon.

MANY CATTLE OUT.

Sheep Shearing Will Be On in a Few Days' Time.

Echo, April 4.—With the big shipments of cattle that have been sent out from here in the past several days, there are but few cattle left that have been feeding during the winter. The stock looks first-class and this has been an excellent year for feeding. Owing to the good weather, there is much hay left in this section of the county. The growers expect to find a good sale for it during the summer months, and some will be shipped out.

Preparing to Shear.

Beginning at this time next week, sheep shearing will be on in this section of the country. In the Butter creek country many thousand head will be sheared by hand, and many of the shearers are already in the field. The shearing plant which was recently purchased by prominent sheepmen in this vicinity is rapidly being prepared for use.

W. H. Daugherty of the Umatilla Ranch company, reports the sales of several small tracts of land in the past week, and says that he still has more to sell. These lands are subject to irrigation and only a few miles from here. Among the recent purchasers are Mr. Reeves, 47 acres, and G. E. Ward, 60 acres.

Union County Commissioners Cut Off One Half County Indebtedness in One Day.

the most remarkable sessions in years.

This large lump was taken from the county's debt by cancelling warrants totaling that amount. This leaves the county debt at something like \$50,000. Adjournment was taken late in the afternoon, after routine business had been transacted.

County Judge Henry and Commissioners J. M. Selder and Ben Brown were engaged nearly all forenoon and a greater portion of the afternoon in cancelling county warrants, which they did to the extent of \$50,000, thus reducing the county debt to about \$65,000, this amount including the estimated accrued interest on outstanding warrants.

The present county court is rapidly reducing the colossal debt until now it is only a matter of not more than two years more until Union county can look every man squarely in the face with the realization that she has not a creditor in existence.

TOOK LIEN ON WELL.

New Law Procedure Is Instituted in North Yakima.

A North Yakima item says of the attachment of a well at that place:—Causing a lien to be placed on a well is a new venture, it appears, from the interest taken in the case recently filed in the county clerk's office. Just what the contestants will do with the hole in the ground is the question.

S. P. Flower and company furnished the well-casing and pump, while J. T. Buffington and son dug the well and put it in service. Neither party has received the pay due them and have caused liens to be placed against the well.

Flower and company claim \$275.90 with interest at 6 per cent since December 3, 1907, and Buffington and son say they are entitled to \$875.59, with like interest. Both firms have joined forces in the action, and besides asking for judgment, request that the defendant be ordered to pay \$75 attorneys' fees.

The well is on the property of Mr. and Mrs. William Yeackel, which is described as the northwest quarter of section 14, township 7, range 22 east, W. M.

In some states in the union a man can give a deed to an artesian well, even though the well is located on another's property. It is considered a separate piece of property and in selling he is given a separate deed to the well.
