IDAHO'S WORLD CHAMPION SHEEP

The following letter from Idaho Falls to the Boise Capital News describes the world's Champion Lincoln ram, "Fleshy Boy," owned by Joseph Empey of that place. The letter says:

There are few sheep on the range that have not their price. All of them are good at current market figures, but there is a ram in this city that cannot be purchased for love nor money, and the cut presented below would indicate in a way his superiority over all the woolly tribe. It is "Fleshy Boy," the ram that has been training with 200 Lincoln ewes recently purchased by Joseph Empey, the well known sheep and stockman of this section.

This animal is a prize winner from every part of the country. He has a string of ribbons captured at various national and other exhibitions which, if sewed together, would picket him in a 40-acre field. The animal weighs 480 pounds, and has a pedigree as long as a nobleman. He is the heaviest sheep in the world. He has been on exhibition here for some time, and has excited the admiration of all stock raisers and particularly sheepmen. Eighty premium ribbons are nailed to his record as a prize animal.

The animal is just four years old, and is a Canadian product, and as a show buck his career dates back to 1905. On August 29 he left Iderton for the Minnesota state fair, and took first money, and champion over all ages. He next appeared at the Portland exhibition, where he won hands down over a ram that had been chosen as a winner over "Fleshy Boy" by a well known Lincoln breeder of the coast. He not only won the first in his class, but the grand championship. Later he was exhibited at the Washington State fair, then at the Inter-Mountain fair at Spokane, and at both exhibitions duplicated what he has already done at previous shows. His brother captured second prize.

At the Chicago International Fat Stock fair, and after a heavy breeding season of 30 days he badly defeated the winner from England, and in 1906 he outclassed all the prize rams on exhibition at the Provincial exhibit in Ontario.

At the Canada Western exhibition in London, Ontario, he was again winner—this time in his own country. He was used in the stud pens again for 30 or 40 days, and was again sent to Chicago, where he duplicated his record for 1906. There is nothing more for him to win, as he is in a class by himself, and has secured all the prizes.

The ancestors of this marvelous sheep are the flock of Henry Dudding of Lincolnshire, England, the most noted Lincoln breeder in the world.

One of his relatives sold for \$7250, and the present owner of "Fleshy Boy" refused \$5000 for him.

TO DO AWAY WITH "COMPS."

Theaters Are Planning to Do Away With Deadheading.
Chicago, April 14.—A movement to abolish complimentary theater tickets is one of the important matters under consideration at the annual meeting of the Middle West Theater Managers' association, which convened this morning at the Sherman House.

Managers of theaters in a dozen states are in attendance, and a project to extend the activities of the association, making it a national organization, will be considered. W. W. Bell, manager of the La Belle Theater in Pittsburg, Kan., is president of the association. Four hundred playhouses are represented in the convention.

Another important matter considered at the meeting is that of discontinuing certain classes of advertising. Most of the managers agree that newspaper advertising affords the only profitable medium for promoting theatrical publicity. One of the principal objects of the association is to protect managers and the public against worthless attractions and in this it has been highly successful.

WILL SHIP IN PURE BRED STOCK

PLANS TO IMPROVE BREEDS AT PULLMAN

Hazlewood Company Will Import a Shipment of Good Dairy Stock in Hopes of Inducing Farmers to Grade Up Herds.

The Pullman Tribune says of a plan to import a shipment of fine cattle to that place for the purpose of grading up the herds now raised by the farmers of that vicinity:

Within a short time Manager Ray Gosselin of the local branch of the Hazlewood company expects to make a thorough canvass of the territory adjacent to Pullman to ascertain how many of the farmers will be willing to order good dairy stock, with a view of interesting enough to warrant the shipping to this section of the country two or three carloads of such stock.

At the present time there are but few really good dairy animals and it is the intention of Mr. Gosselin to have a large number shipped in. It is probable that if enough animals can be ordered, the Hazlewood company will send a man to the dairy sections in the middle west and ship out the required number as it did in the Watachee and Yakima countries.

With two or three carloads of pure bred or at least good grade cattle, the time will not be far distant when the Palouse country will be noted for its excellent dairy stock.

The college has several good sires of the dairy types at the farm and there is little necessity of shipping in many male animals. The Guernsey, redpoll and several other breeds are not represented at the farms, however, and the animals of these breeds would necessarily have to be brought in.

The plan of securing a pure bred sire and grade cattle and breeding up to a first class standard as is now being done by a number of men adjacent to Pullman is an excellent one, but the time when a pure bred herd may be secured is a long way off. The bringing of a number of good dairy cows and then breeding to the dairy strains would hasten the time when only first class milchers would be found in the stalls of the dairy barns of the Palouse country.

The farmers near Palouse last year secured a number of cattle as is suggested by Mr. Gosselin and are making more rapid strides towards pure bred herds than those in the vicinity of Pullman. Pullman farmers are just as progressive and they cannot well afford to be outstripped by their neighbors.

Exclude Immoral Mexicans.

Tucson, Ariz., April 14.—Immigration officials have commenced a crusade which is likely to result in a great diminution in the population of the red light districts of the various towns and cities along the Mexican border. A large proportion of the inmates of immoral resorts are Mexican women and these will be sent back to Mexico. The deportation of this class of women is undertaken under the section of the new immigration law, which provides that any alien who comes to this country and within three years thereafter becomes an immoral character may be deported. Many arrests have already been made and a general cleaning up of the resorts along the border in Arizona, New Mexico and Texas is expected.
