AMONG THE EXCHANGES OF THE INLAND EMPIRE

Many Land Contests On.

The local U. S. land office has been the scene of unusual activity for the past couple of days on account of land trials and contests being carried on there. H. T. Jones, special agent for the government, appearing for the government, says The Dalles Chronicle. This is one of a series of contests that have been begun by the government in this land district, there being about a hundred claims that either have been or will be investigated. Trials were held at Condon April 2, 3 and 4, at Heppner April 6, 7 and 8 and at Moro April 9, 10 and 11.

These contests come as a result of suspensions during the past 2 to 6 years by the government of home-stead entries and final proofs where the claimants were suspected of obtaining the land for fraudulent purposes. These have accumulated through these years until now there are about a hundred that must be decided.

These contests are being watched with a great deal of interest by those interested in government land affairs, for it is thought that while no decisions have yet been rendered the decisions in the earlier trials will furnish precedent for decrees to be rendered in subsequent contests, of which the statute of limitations has not run before the government filed charges.

Rivers Are Rising.

The continued warm weather has resulted in a marked rise in the Snake and Clearwater rivers, the latter at noon today showing the Clearwater river to have risen three feet during the past two and a half days.

Reports received from the upper Clearwater country are to the effect that creeks draining the upper snow regions are rising very rapidly and it is expected the rivers will again reach the high water marks if the warm weather continues.

Fruit men are congratulating themselves on the melting of the snow on the low mountains, as it is believed there is little danger from frost after the snow is melted.—Lewiston Teller.

False Teeth Delay Wedding.

The wedding of Helme Ritter, the crack basketball boxer of the Spokane Athletic club, is hanging fire, so it is declared, while the board of trustees of the association, wrestles with the question of whether it will advance \$34 for a set of false teeth that the dentist made for the boxer but which he will not part with till the sum is forthcoming, says the Spokesman-Review. Ritter asserts that he lost the teeth while he was boxing for the honor and glory of the

athletic club, and that the institution should pay the bill for having them replaced.

Early in the season Ritter lost a front tooth in a bout at the club, but that single void in his mouth did not bother much and he never gave the matter much thought. But when he had two other teeth badly jarred about a month ago he decided to have a dentist conduct an investigation and this resulted in two other shining ivory teeth being extracted. River Boats in Service.

Dorsey B. Smith, superintendent of the Open River Transportation company, is in the city from Portland and is making many friends for his line of boats. Mr. Smith was formerly private secretary for A. L. Mohler and recently assistant superintendent of the O. R. & N. The Teal will be put on a permanent run the 20th of this month, and Mr. Smith says, "it will run all winter and show what business can be done on this river." The Relief will be placed on the run from Celilo to up river points.—The Dalles Chronicle.

Promoter at Lewiston.

Charles Francis Adams, the founder of the Lewiston-Clarkston company, is an arrival from his Boston home and will participate as a guest of Lewiston and Clarkston in the celebration of the opening of the new railroad from Lewiston to Riparia.

Mr. Adams visits Lewiston and Clarkston each year, and in response to a special invitation has arranged to make his visit this year so as to be able to join in the road opening celebration.—Lewiston Teller.

Hay and Potatoes Advance.

Alfalfa is now quoted at Tacoma at \$13 a ton. An advance of \$1 has been marked up against it due to the strengthening of the market east of the mountains, says the Yakima Republic. Stocks of first-class alfalfa are declared to be running low. There is apparently an unlimited quantity of damaged or inferior hay, but the really first grade article is not as plentiful as might be imagined. The general tendency in both hay and potatoes is a slow upward growth.

REVIEW OF WORLD AUTO RACE.

American Car Loses Lead After Masterly Strokes.

An expert who can sum up the true status of the New York to Paris automobile race is being sought by the Spokane Motor club to give a lecture before the members, the knights of the gasoline wagons being "up a tree" as they say regarding the whole affair and anxious to know just exactly what there is to it, says the Spokesman Review.

The announcement that America's entry was returning to Seattle from Alaska has put the whole outlook of the race in a peculiar light and raises some interesting questions.

Perhaps the American car has already won the race without continuing the race to Paris. In the original rules, which were, however, very vague, it stated that should the journey not be continued the winner would be the car which went the farthest on the original route. This the American car has done by going to Alaska, and it is altogether unlikely that any other car will go by way of that country.

The American car has lost the lead of two weeks which it had on its nearest competitor at San Francisco, through a lot of strategy which was played by the foreigners. Arriving at San Francisco, about a thousand miles ahead of the race, there was no opportunity for any conference nor any decision as to the future course, and it remained for the American car either to await the coming of the other competitors or to start on the route originally planned.

No satisfactory direction or explanation could be received from the officials and committees in charge of the race, and therefore the car was shipped to a videz by the steamship Santa Barbara.

Upon their arrival at Valdez, the American crew apparently discovered what people familiar with Alaska had already surmised—that the roads were absolutely impassable, and it remained for them to retrace their course to Seattle. Here they will find the Italian and French cars, and it is altogether probable that the three cars will be shipped direct to Yokohama, continue thence to Vladivostok and thence by the central Asiatic route, rather than by the north coast.

This will put the American car again on an equal footing with its two nearest foreign competitors and within halting distance of the third. The fear of about a thousand miles, or of about two weeks, which it had upon the foreigners at San Francisco, is lost. The advantage which it would have had by arriving in Alaska on an earlier steamer is also lost.
