Former Weston Man Here From Los Angeles.

Weston, April 17.—The farmers have begun a campaign for good roads. South of town subscriptions

for more than 200 days work with teams have been secured by F. C. Greer. One farmer, W. H. Booher, gives 20 days work and the free use of his rock quarry. East of town the movement is in charge of J. M. O'Hara. The county, which agrees to pay expenses of crushing the rock if the city will donate the use of its rock crusher, and the farmers will haul and spread the material. It is proposed to spread the rock 15 feet wide.
