APPROPRIATE EASTER
EXERCISES AT CHURCHES

Walla Walla Traction Company Given Right of Way Through Weston Streets—Musician from Milton to Give Concert Here—Two New Automobiles This Week—Wattsburg Beats Normal Team.

Weston, April 18.—Sunday evening the W. C. T. U. will give an entertainment at the United Brethren church, consisting of songs, recitations, etc., appropriate for Easter. Most of the churches of the city will have appropriate Easter exercises.

Miss Ethel Martin, the accomplished instructor of music at Columbia college at Milton, will give an entertainment at Weston opera house next Friday evening.

Mrs. H. Pinkerton, who was in the hospital in Walla Walla, has returned home.

Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Clark have purchased from A. F. Turner for \$900 the residence property they have been occupying on Armar street.

More Automobiles.
F. E. King and Zeke O'Hara, have each purchased automobiles from Stagg & Lavender, the popular dealers at this place. They are \$1600 Maxwell touring cars.

It is reported that the promoters of the electric line into Milton from Walla Walla will make all possible speed in getting the line into Weston. The Weston normal team was defeated on its visit to Wattsburg in a good game with the high school there the score being 9 to 5.

Grant a Franchise.

The Walla Walla Traction company has been granted the franchise for operating an electric line through Weston Main street at the last meeting of the council. The traction company contracts to build a substantial bridge across Pine creek on North Water street, with passage ways for team and pedestrian, and to keep the superstructure in repair. The city receives the nominal sum of \$5 annually for the use of its street. Construction must be begun by the company within 18 months and completed within two years or its franchise becomes void. Rights of way have been deeded by the farmers for nearly the entire way from Milton to Weston, and in almost every instance no compensation was asked from the company.

RAILROAD WON'T OBEY.

O. R. & N. Does Not Comply With Rate Order of the Commission.

The state railroad commission has not yet fixed the date when the new distributive rates on the O. R. & N. from Portland to points east of The Dalles are to be put into effect. And those most vitally concerned, namely, the O. R. & N. and the shippers, do not appear to know when the order will become operative, says a Portland paper.

Up to the present time, though the decision was handed down a couple of weeks ago, the railroad company has had no intimation as to when the order will be signed, sealed and delivered. Judge Cotton, general counsel for the railroad corporation, admitted this morning that he had received a copy of the commission's decision identical with the copy published some time ago in the local press, but that places no obligation upon the O. R. & N.

It did not come in the form of a mandate directing the company to revise and re-issue tariff schedules to conform to the ruling, it being simply a notice that the railroad commission had announced its findings.

Since the handing down of the ruling, there have been a number of preliminary matters to attend to, which, it is understood, must be disposed of before the issuance of the formal order. One of these matters is the complaint of the Baker City commercial organization asking for an equalizing rate out of Baker City.

NEW MARITAL LAW FOR CATHOLICS

ALL ENGAGEMENTS MUST
BE SIGNED BY PARTIES.

Catholic Marriages Only Valid When Performed by Parish Priest to Whom the Parties Belong—Only Two Exceptions to the Rule—Those Married Outside the Church Must Be Remarried.

New York, April 18.—Important changes in the marriage regulations of the Catholic church will become effective tomorrow throughout the country, in compliance with the papal decree, "Ne Temere." A synopsis of the rules follows:

1—All engagements and promises to marry, to be valid, must be signed in writing by the contracting parties, also by the parish priest or by the bishop, or at least by two witnesses.

2—Marriages of Catholics or of those who ever were Catholics will be valid only when celebrated by a parish priest, bishop of the diocese or by a priest delegated by either, and at least two witnesses. The two exceptions to this are in case a priest cannot be had, in which case the parties may, after a month, contract privately in presence of two witnesses; second, in danger of death, when parties may marry before any priest and two witnesses.

3—Marriages to be both valid and lawful must be celebrated before the pastor of the parties or before a priest allowed by him.

4—Before Catholics who are married outside the church can regard themselves as man and wife they must go before a priest and be remarried.

The new law requires the record of marriages in the baptismal records as well as the marriage record.
