

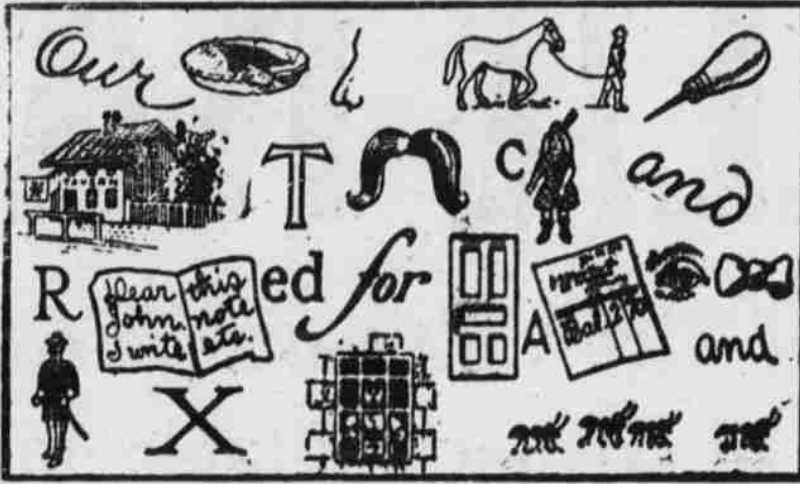

INGERSOLL'S CLASSIC ON INTEMPERANCE

Robert G. Ingersoll, the great infidel and orator, once delivered an address on intemperance and in the course of his remarks gave utterance to the following classic on alcohol. It is considered a masterpiece of literature and coming from the great agnostic who was free to express his opinion on all subjects at all times, it is worthy of preservation as a literary heirloom of the nation. He said:

I am aware that there is a prejudice against any man who manufactures alcohol. I believe that from the time it issues from the coiled and poisonous worm in the distillery until it empties into the jaws of death, dishonor, and crime it demoralizes everybody that touches it from its source to where it ends.

I do not believe anybody can contemplate the object without being prejudiced against the liquor crime. All we have to do, gentlemen, is to think of the wrecks on either bank of the stream of death, of the suicides, of the insanity, of the ignorance, of the destitution, of the little children tugging at the faded and withered breast of weeping and despairing mothers, of wives asking for bread, of the men of genius it has wrecked, the men struggling with imaginary serpents, produced by this devilish drink; and when you think of the jails, of the almshouses, of the asylums, of the prisons, of the scaffolds upon either bank, I do not wonder that every thoughtful man is prejudiced against this damned stuff called "alcohol."

Intemperance cuts down youth in its vigor, manhood in its strength, old age in its weakness. It breaks the father's heart, hurls the dotting mother, extinguishes natural affection, erases conjugal love, blots out filial attachment, blights parental house, brings down mourning age in sorrow to the grave. It produces weakness, not strength; sickness, not health; death, not life. It makes wives widows, children orphans, fathers fiends, and all of them paupers and beggars.

It feeds rheumatism, invites cholera, imports pestilence, and embraces consumption. It covers the land with idleness, misery and crime. It fills your jails, supplies your almshouses,

and demands your asylums. It engenders controversies, fosters quarrels and cherishes riots. It crowds your penitentiaries, and furnishes victims for your scaffolds.

It is the life blood of the gambler, the element of the burglar, the prop of the highwayman, and support of the midnight incendiary. It countenances the liar, respects the thief, esteems the blasphemer. It violates obligation, reverences fraud and honors infamy. It defames benevolence, hates love, scorns virtue, and slanders innocence.

It incites the father to butcher his helpless offspring, helps the husbands to massacre his wife, and the child to grind the patrician's ax. It burns up men, consumes women, detests life, curses God, despises heaven. It suborns witnesses, nurses perjury, defiles the jury box, and stains the judicial ermine. It degrades the citizen, debases the legislator, dishonors the statesman, and disarms the patriot.

It brings shame, not honor; misery, not safety; despair, not hope; sorrow, not happiness, and with the maelstrom of a fiend it calmly surveys its frightful desolation and unsatiated havoc. It poisons felicity, kills peace, ruins morals, blights confidence, slays reputation, and wipes out national honor, then curses the world and laughs at its ruin. It does all that and more. It murders the soul.

It is the sum of all villainies, the father of all crimes, the mother of all abominations, the devil's best friend, and God's worst enemy.

MOVEMENT TO CANADA.

Ottawa Report Says Thousands are Going North.

The movement into the Canadian northwest from the border states will be somewhat larger this year than last, says an Ottawa report. It is pointed out that the move Canada-wards is principally from Utah, the Dakotas, Minnesota and other western states, the people disposing of their lands there at upward of \$50 per acre to take up land in Canada at \$10 per acre or less.

If there has been an increase of arrivals from the United States, the same can not be said of those from Britain. This is due to the stricter regulations which have been adopted by Canada in connection with settlers from the British Isles.

A feature of the present movement from the United States to Canada is the repatriation of French Canadians. Thousands of these people are this year abandoning the manufacturing centers of New England and the middle states, and are either returning to Quebec or are swelling the tide of newcomers to the provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan. So far Rhode Island and New Hampshire have furnished the largest contingent of those returning north.

WOMAN MAY TIE UP PROJECT.

Owner of Yakima Valley Homestead Objects to Irrigation Dam.

Operations of the Pleasant Valley Irrigation company, one of the largest enterprises now under way in this valley, may be tied up by injunction proceedings which Miss Laura Flickinger of Long Beach, Cal. threatens through her attorney, says a North Yakima item.

The Pleasant Valley Irrigation company is constructing a dam to hold the waters of the East Selah valley. Miss Flickinger is the owner of 160 acres of land which will be under water if the dam is ever put to use. On her land is a spring, which, it is contended, furnishes enough water to enable her to cultivate her land should she so desire.

She thus considers her property to be valuable and is willing to sell at a

fair price. So far, however, the company has proceeded with its work without reference to her. Miss Flickinger is in North Yakima now to decide what course she will pursue.
