

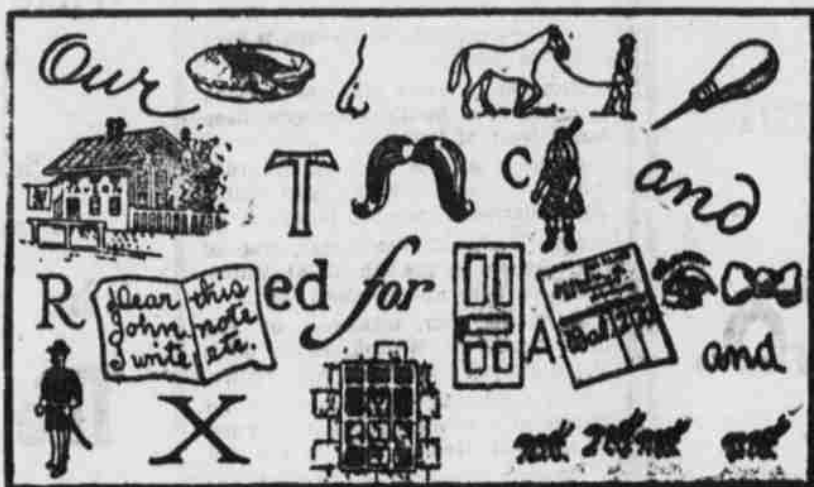

Water is running through the ditches in the Hermiston unit, and everything looks very favorable for a good year in every way. Buildings are going up and Hermiston will continue to grow.

Walla Walla parties who recently purchased considerable land in this vicinity are improving the same, and are very enthusiastic over the prospects of the country.

THE OWLS IN TROUBLE.

New Brotherhood Having Hard Time to Live in the Northwest.

A. McKeen of Seattle, supreme organizer of the Order of Owls, is in North Yakima on a mission of more than local interest. It is to establish a nest of the order here and by so doing to absorb the existing membership of the Brotherhood of Owls, says a Yakima paper.

The Order of Owls is the parent organization and had its birth at South Bend, Ind., some years ago. The brotherhood is a Walla Walla movement two years old and has the major part of its membership in this state. The brotherhood, it is alleged, is an imitation of the order and has met considerable success, according to members of the order, among people who thought they were becoming identified with the parent body.

Mr. McKeen is not here to bring about an amalgamation of the two orders. His mission is to organize a nest of the order and he expects that this will result in killing the brotherhood local as its membership will naturally seek membership in the older association.

A meeting of the executive committee of the brotherhood is to be held tonight at which there will be a decision as to the course to be pursued.

Mr. McKeen comes to North Yakima with letters of instruction to Z. Y. Coleman, Lee Tittle, Sheriff Edwards and a number of others in public and private life, given him by Spokane friends and members of the Order of Owls.
