PENDLETON MAN PREACHED HERE SUNDAY LAST.

School Has Been Closed for the Present Term—Crops Look Good in Vicinity of Pilot Rock—Wheat and Fruit Prospects Are Very Good—Pilot Rock Growing.

Pilot Rock, April 28.—Rev. W. H. Bleakney, principal of Pendleton academy, occupied the pulpit in the Pilot Rock church Sunday morning and evening, in the absence of Rev. Levi Johnson, who is at Moro, attending the spring meeting of the Pendleton presbytery. The meetings were well attended.

The Pilot Rock public school has been closed for the present term.

A number of the people from here have been county seat visitors of late. The crops are looking first-class in the vicinity of Pilot Rock of late. An excellent crop of wheat and fruits are expected.

Fruits will be raised in this section of the country more extensively than heretofore, as it can be easily shipped out since the railroad has been run in. Pilot Rock has grown of late, and it will grow more as the country will demand it. New land is being taken up, and it will be only a short time when many hundreds of additional acres of land will be producing crops.

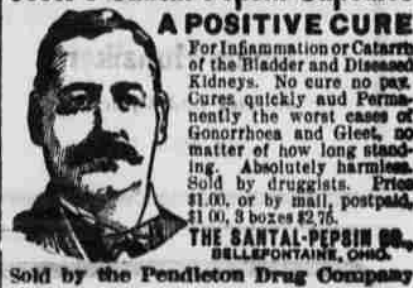
