Whips Hubby's Companion.

A disgraceful affair took place at Fifteenth and Alturas streets this afternoon, when after an exciting chase of several blocks an angry wife caught up with her husband, who was out buggy riding with a young lady, and using a horsewhip with great force, administered a severe lashing to the young woman, who was claiming her husband's attention, says the Boise Capital News.

The elderly woman was accompanied by a girl and they were driving a fine rig. When they overtook the man and girl, the woman jumped out of her buggy with the whip and after striking the girl with the man a blow or two in the buggy, the young woman jumped from the buggy and attempted to run, but was caught by the waist and severely punished. After the girl had left the buggy, the man drove off at a rapid pace, leaving his young companion to the mercies of his angry wife, who exhausted her energies in the beating she administered. She then climbed back into her buggy and drove away, following her rapidly-disappearing husband.

Dying Child Cries for Convict Father.

Crying for his father, who is a convict at the state penitentiary, the 5-year-old child of James Darnell, a member of the McGinnis gang of box car robbers, died this morning in a tent on South Front street, says the Yakima Republic. The wife of the convicted car robber has lived ever since her husband has been in the penitentiary on the frugal earnings she has been able to procure and with her child has dwelt in a broken down camp in the south end of the city. The child has been sick for months. He has begged ever since his illness to be taken to his father, whose abode is a narrow cell in the Washington state penitentiary at Walla Walla. The mother is in despair. Her life has been one of toil and privation since Darnell was taken away last fall. Neighbors have offered the woman

assistance in the burying of her young son. It is stated that she is entirely without money with which to give the child a decent burial.

Cigarette Causes Fire.

Yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock a blaze was discovered in a barn owned by H. Glenn adjoining the band stand in the city park and used by Mr. Sawtelle, a teamster in this city, says The Dalles Chronicle. The fire company reached the scene with remarkable promptitude and soon had the fire under control, and the yards and park were soon filled with citizens expecting to see quite a blaze, but fortunately there was no damage done aside from the burning of the shingles on the shed roof of the barn which it will cost about \$10 to replace. It is thought the fire was caused by small boys smoking cigarettes around the barn. It was discovered that the straw and refuse that filled the space immediately back of the shed had been burning; from this it is believed the barn had caught on fire.

Bad Indian Arrested.

Billy Dixon, the Simcoe Indian who made a murderous assault upon Town Marshal Clarence Adams of Yakima City, on the road to the reservation Thursday night, will be charged with assault and intent to commit a felony, or attempted murder, and the information against him will be filed direct by Prosecuting Attorney Wendt in the superior court, to avoid the necessity of a preliminary hearing. Dixon has not yet secured counsel says the Yakima Republic. Dixon has a bad reputation. A few years ago he attempted to hold up Sheriff Edwards while the latter was riding through Union Gap. The Indian rode up to the sheriff and seized the bridle of his horse. The sheriff pulled his gun and was able to scare the man away without shooting. Dixon, however, had a narrow escape on that occasion of receiving a load of lead in his carcass.

To Plan Hughes Campaign.

New York, April 30.—For the purpose of outlining a plan of campaign to secure the nomination of Hughes for president, New York delegates began a conference this morning at the Manhattan hotel. The conference will probably last through tomorrow and a well-defined program will be mapped out. The conference was called by General Stewart L. Woodford, president of the National Hughes league. It is reported that many of the New York delegates are only half-hearted in their support of Hughes and the friends of the governor hope to stimulate the wavering allegiance and arouse activity and enthusiasm in the ranks of New York republicans.

BIG WOOL CLIP.

Wyoming Clip Will Exceed All Previous Records.

Estimates now being made as to the size of the Wyoming wool clip indicate that this year Wyoming will not only exceed all previous records but it is expected will pass Montana which last year was nip and tuck with this state in its total wool production. Wyoming last year with a production of 33,600,000 pounds took the lead for wool in the grass, but Montana's figures on scoured wool exceeded that of this state, says the Wyoming Tribune.

This year the clip is expected to be at least 35,000,000 pounds, and it is confidently expected that this amount when scoured will also exceed the scoured product of Montana, its nearest competitor.

The average weight of a fleece last year was 7.2 pounds, while this year in addition to the wool being of longer staple and finer quality, the weight will probably average close to eight pounds. The advantage to the sheepmen of the state through this gain alone will be readily seen.

The rains of the past few days appear to be more scarce in the immediate vicinity of Cheyenne than anywhere else and storms in Central Wyoming have done great good, and are bringing green grass into sight.

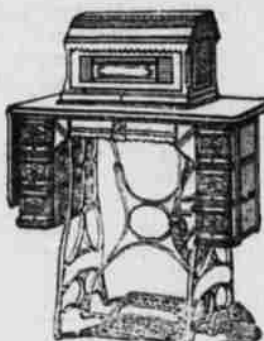
