JEWISH CHARITIES.

Conference Precedes National Conference of Charities.

Richmond, Va., May 4.—Preceding the national conference of charities and corrections which will open its meeting later this week, the fifth biennial session of the national conference of Jewish charities was opened here today and will last through tomorrow and Wednesday. The national conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic charitable organization, also began its business sessions this morning, with a discussion on the subject of "Dependent Families and Children."

Among the subjects slated for discussion by the Jewish society are: "Jewish Charitable Activities in Russia," "The Unification of Jewish Communal Activities," "Inter-Municipal Co-operation in Charitable Activities," "The Need of a Distinctively Jewish Tendency in the conduct of Jewish Educational Institutions." The conference will also discuss the advisability of organizing Jewish charitable effort in the smaller communities.

WORLD CONFERENCE ON TELEGRAPHY

Lisbon, Portugal, May 4.—An international telegraph conference at which nearly all the governments of Europe and America are represented, was opened in Lisbon today. The United States is represented by Chas. Page Bryan, United States minister to Portugal, and Roland R. Dennis, a special agent of the department of commerce and labor, stationed at Berlin. The United States army is also represented by a member of the signal corps. One of the important matters before the conference is a revision of the cable and telegraph codes now in use by the business interests of the world.

Nearly all the South American states have sent representatives, who are attempting to bring about the abrogation of the present code system, substituting therefore the old rule limiting messages to words conveying their full import, and taken from seven European languages. In this case the smaller republics will not get the backing of their big neighbors. It is not to be a Pan-American position versus a Pan-Eur. The United States will join Ery. the France, Germany and other important nations of Europe in protest against the proposed change.

Having established the telegraphic "esperanto" whereby great saving of tolls has been effected, the business world is naturally not inclined to return to a system that is more unwieldy and, what is worse, much more expensive. One banking house in New York has just completed the compilation of a new code book at a cost of \$18,000 and another at a cost of \$25,000. These are but instances of

a sufficient number to run into the millions and these would be worthless were the proposition carried into effect. The fact that this suggested change would make cabling much more expensive is what commends it to the South American states. Their revenues would be expanded by the increased tolls.
