CIRCUS NOTES.

The Barnum and Bailey circus played an extended engagement at Madison Square Garden, New York City this spring.

The Ringling Brothers circus began their season at the Coliseum, Chicago. It is reported that their business was very large.

The Greater Norris and Rowe circus, museum, menagerie, hippodrome and congress of nations, began their season in San Francisco this year. In thirty days the big show played to 278,873 paid admissions. The press of the city were enthusiastic in their praise of the new big show.

By arrangement of the three big circuses, each of them opened their season in the metropolis of the various sections of the country that they will play. Barnum and Bailey circus will play the New England states; the Ringling Bros., the middle west and southern states, and the Greater Norris and Rowe circus the territory west of the Rockies. Thus each section of the country will have one of the big shows this year.

It is estimated that the three big circuses of the country, the Ringling Bros., the Greater Norris and Rowe, and the Barnum and Bailey shows, that there are 1800 people, 1000 horses, 100 elephants, 175 cars, besides hundreds of other animals used. It costs about \$12,000 a day to operate these shows. They are about of equal size and importance this year.

It is estimated that the distance covered by the three big shows this season will exceed in the aggregate 45,000 miles. Each show will travel on three special trailers, it is said.

The Greater Norris and Rowe circus will exhibit at Pendleton Thursday, May 14th.

NEW APPLICATION BLANKS.

Land Office Receives Supply of New Papers for Entrymen.

The land office department through Frank C. Bramwell, register of the local land office, has made public an announcement which will mean much to the office itself, the newspapers of the state and the people who have to do with public lands in general, says the La Grande Observer.

The department of the interior has made a radical change in the form on which applications for homesteads, desert lands and timber and stone entries are made. Heretofore and since 1878, the form has had a few minor changes, all tending to shorten the wording of the application which is always printed in a newspaper nearest the land filed on.

After the 15th inst., the form will be much shorter, and all classes of applications must be made on the same style of blanks. Each class of land was customarily applied for on a distinct and separate form. Beginning with the 15th, however, one form will be used in all classes.

Considerable change has been made in the manner of publishing affidavits as well.

The heir to the throne, Alfonso, Prince of the Asturias, was born May 10, 1907, and his first birthday tomorrow will also be the occasion for much rejoicing throughout the kingdom.

To Lay Cornerstone.

Washington, May 9.—President Roosevelt will deliver an address Monday at the laying of the cornerstone of the new building of the bureau of American republics. Other speakers will be Secretary of State Elihu Root, American Ambassador Joaquin Nabuco of Brazil, and Andrew Carnegie, who donated \$750,000 for the new building.

New York, May 9.—By request of the department of church and labor of the Presbyterian church, 11,000 ministers of that denomination in the United States will hold special labor Sunday services tomorrow. All of the local unions affiliated with the American Federation of Labor have been
