Twenty-Mile Flume.

The Kamiah Progress of Kamiah, Idaho, gives the following interesting article relative to the project of installing a 20-mile flume along the Lolo creek.

"Information reached Kamiah this week that surveyors are now engaged in running the preliminary survey for the mammoth flume up Lolo creek for a distance of 20 miles. This project has been worked upon for nearly a year and it is reported that the financial end has been arranged for. It will require a large amount of money to carry the project through and when it is once started will be of untold benefit to Kamiah and the ridges on the east side of the river. While the timber products of a country can be taken down a flume nothing can be taken up so anything going in must be taken from the nearest railway station and Kamiah is the nearest one and has the only feasible routes to all points on the upper Lolo and should reap much benefit from any improvement of the stream and our business men should see that the Lolo-Kamiah road is put through as soon as possible and also give as much encouragement as they can to all roads leading across the river.

After One—Gets Two.

According to word received in Walla Walla today, Deputy Warden J. D. Smith of the penitentiary, picked up an escaped convict, J. Reardon, in San Francisco yesterday, says the Walla Walla Bulletin. Deputy Warden Smith went to California recently to bring back an escaped convict, John E. Powell, who is being held in San Jose.

Yesterday Smith stopped off in San Francisco to renew old acquaintances, and accidentally ran across Reardon on the street. Reardon was arrested and is being held until requisition papers can be secured for his return to the Washington penitentiary.

Paving Plant at Wallace.

Wallace Press: Plans in connection with the proposed purchase by the city of a paving plant of its own, and paving the whole city, were discussed last night at the city council meeting. While the opinion of all was not given on the matter, several declared themselves in favor. They claimed that by purchasing a plant all the streets could be paved for what it would cost to have only a part of them. By owning its own paving plant which can be secured for about \$10,000, and paying the bitulthic company 75 cents per square yard for the bitulthic cement and technical services of an expert on paving, the city could pave the streets at a minimum cost and the contrac-

tor's profits would be saved to the people. This matter will be thoroughly investigated and prices of machinery and material obtained and reported at a later meeting.

Lewiston-Seattle Service.

At a meeting of the governing board of the Commercial club tonight the matter of securing a direct train service from Seattle over the Northern Pacific when the new river line is placed in commission will receive attention, says the Lewiston Tribune. Several months ago, upon the visit here of the Seattle business men, they gave assurance that so soon as new railroad service was inaugurated out of Lewiston down the Snake river they would take up the subject with the Northern Pacific of securing a direct service between Lewiston and Seattle. This will be possible with the completion of the Northern Pacific line between Pasco and Riparia connecting with the new Lewiston-Riparia road. The Lewiston-Seattle service would be by way of Spokane, and would lessen the traveling distance between this point and Puget sound cities several hours.

"Old Bones."

"Old Bones," one of the oldest Indians in the country, and well known in this part of the state on account of the many troubles he has had with the Northern Pacific Railway company, concerning lands owned by him in Franklin county, was in the city Saturday, says the Walla Walla Union. He still persists that the railway company is trying to rob him, although the difficulties have been settled through the land office for some time. "Old Bones" is a typical Indian of the early days and his trip here yesterday was one of his periodical visits to the "city."

Trout to Stock Streams.

Deputy State Game and Fish Warden W. A. Hill has received word that 300,000 eastern brook trout will be shipped to reach Lewiston within the next two weeks to be planted in the streams of central Idaho, says the Lewiston Teller.

Mr. Hill is now engaged in selecting the places to plant the fish and will announce the persons to superintend the planting within the next few days.

COAST RECORD BROKEN.

De Volt of O. A. C., Lowers Five Mile Record.

The coast record for five miles was broken on a slow track at the state fair grounds yesterday afternoon, when a special meet was held under A. A. U. rules and sanctioned by the A. A. U. officials to decide whether or not the Indian runners in the recent Salem-Portland relay made the time credited to them on the first lap, says the Salem Statesman. It was claimed that Walter Haight had made his lap in 29 minutes, 53 seconds, a distance of slightly under 5½ miles. The race yesterday was to test the speed of the Chemawa runners, and was open to all registered amateur athletes.

The entries for the race, in the order in which they drew places, were as follows: Peter Casey, George Williams, Sam John, Lewis Sanderson, and Apis Watkins, Michael Wilson, Amos Smoker, Frank Dan and Walter Haight of Chemawa.

The race started shortly after 3 o'clock, and in the first lap the men

strung out along the track very nearly in the order in which they finished. On the home stretch De Volt of Corvallis passed Haight and won by about eight feet in the fast time of 28:29 1-5, breaking the coast record. Haight's time was a little over a second slower.

The former coast record of 28:57 3-5 was held by Fred Verner of Chicago, and was made on August 4, 1905, during the athletics event in connection with the Lewis and Clark fair at Portland.

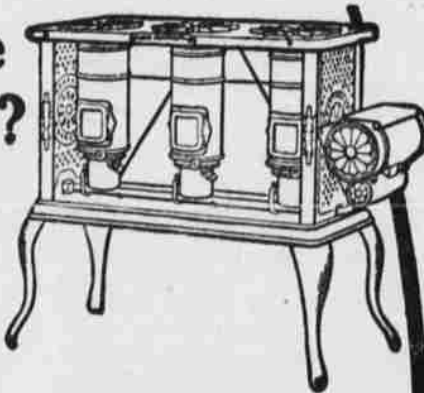
