ANCIENT FESTIVAL

THOUSANDS OF ITALIANS
CELEBRATE GREAT EVENT

Famous Procession of Cero—Description of Ceremonies and What They Mean—Bishop and King Participate in the Exercises—Both Elaborate and Impressive.

Rome, May 15.—Thousands of pilgrims from all parts of Italy and from other lands are gathering today in the little Umbrian town of Gubbio, to witness the famous procession of the cero, which the natives hold every year on May 15 in honor of their native saint and former bishop, St. Ubaldo. This quaint ceremonial dates back to the mists of antiquity and is said to have been of heathen origin.

A cero is a tall wooden pole or mast which passes through the middle of two lantern shaped frames of wood and canvas, separated from each other and surmounted by the figure of a saint. The lower extremity of the mast fits into a wooden stretcher provided with two long shafts, one at each end, so that it can be borne along the steep streets and up the mountain side above the town on the stilted backs of the young and vigorous.

These cero are three in number, and each is surmounted by the image of a separate saint—the first by that of St. Ubaldo, the second by that of St. George and the third by that of St. Antonio.

St. George's Cero. St. George's cero rests on supports representing a heap of wine barrels, a collection from various shops, a drum, mace and battleaxe and a pile of spears, because that warrior saint is the patron of the shop keepers, as according to Napoleon I, he was in England.

At 5 o'clock in the afternoon the bishop gives his benediction to the cero, and then at a given signal the cero is dashed down the steep Via Dante at full speed, bearing the three cero in rapid succession round the town.

All the time the great bell of the palace is tolling; finally the bearers of the cero rush wildly thrice around the square. Then out of the square the procession rushes up the hill to the gate of St. Ubaldo, which leads through the ivy-clad walls to the hillside.

At the gate the bearers rest a few minutes. Then off they start, and soon St. Ubaldo's yellow cope and St. George's blue cloak, followed by St. Antonio's black habit, may be descried speeding up the steep serpentine of Mount Ingino. Arrived at the top, St. Ubaldo is first admitted into the monastery, grates three times around the court, his image is then carried into the church, the others then follow and the procession is at an end.

GOOD ROADS CONVENTION.

National Meeting Under Auspices of Automobile Association.

Buffalo, N. Y., May 15.—Reports received here from all over the country are highly flattering in their promises of the success of the National Good Roads convention to be held in Buffalo July 6, 7 and 8.

The meeting will be under the auspices of the American Automobile association and will immediately precede the start of the Glidden tour. As the association now has 24 state branches, the event will probably be the most truly national as well as the biggest good roads convention ever held in this country.

The convenient proximity of Niagara Falls makes the selection of Buffalo particularly commendable for July, aside from the fact of the Glidden tour starting from there on July 9. The proceedings of the convention itself will be attractive enough to repay every one in the least interested for attending.

There will be prominent speakers, but the affair will by no means be confined to oratory. Practical demonstrations will be given of new machinery used in the building, preservation and repairing of roads, and various novel features are being arranged to make it a gala occasion, replete with entertainment, as well as instruction and practical results.

Electrical Wizards to Meet.

Chicago, May 15.—Chicago will be the meeting place next week of some of the world's famous wizards of electricity, when the National Electric Light association opens its annual convention next Tuesday. The honorary membership list of the association bears the names of Thomas A. Edison, Nicola Tesla, I. Fulkerson, Edison, Marcel Deprez of Paris, Sylvanus B. Thompson of London; Elhu Thompson of Lynn, Mass.; Joseph W. Swan of Kent, England, and others almost as well known. All of these have been invited to next week's gathering and several are expected to be

in attendance. Dudley Farrand of Newark, N. J., is president of the association. One of the largest electrical exhibitions ever in this country will be open during the convention, and a daily paper devoted to convention proceedings, will be published while the convention is in session.

Visit Central America.

Washington, May 15.—William I. Buchanan, special envoy from the United States to the Central American republics, sailed today from Salinas Cruz, Mexico, for Punta Arenas, Costa Rica, according to advice received in Washington. The United States cruiser Albany is conveying the envoy, who is accompanied by Ambassador Enrique Creel, Mexico's envoy. The cruiser will reach Costa Rica in time to permit the envoys to attend the opening next month of the supreme court of justice of Central America in San Jose. Owing to the disturbed condition of affairs in Guatemala, that country has been omitted from the itinerary of the return trip, which will include stops in Nicaragua and Salvador.

Texas for Taft.

Fort Worth, Tex., May 15.—Secretary Taft is the presidential choice of the regular republican party of Texas, which is holding its state convention in Fort Worth today. The meeting was marked by great enthusiasm for Roosevelt and many delegates favor Taft as second choice.

Waco, Texas, May 15.—The reorganized or negro faction of the republican party is holding its state and congressional convention here today, with many delegates from all over Texas in attendance. The convention is unalterably opposed to Taft's candidacy.

Independence Party.

San Francisco, May 15.—Delegates at large to the national convention of the Independence league will be elected at a convention of the California branch of the party tomorrow. Secretary Wanier O'Connell of the state committee, is enthusiastic at the prospects of the party in the Golden state, declaring that the republican party is corrupt and the democratic party disintegrated, and that the dissatisfied voters of both old parties in California are flocking to the banners of the Independence organization.

Mexican War Veterans.

Waco, Tex., May 15.—Survivors of the historic struggle with Mexico, in which so many Texans participated, met here today for the annual reunion of the Texas Association of Mexican War Veterans. Time has greatly thinned the ranks and left but a handful of aged veterans to enjoy the hospitality of the patriotic people of Waco, which will be poured out in unstinted measure during the two days of the meeting.

Engineers in Session.

Columbus, O., May 15.—Members of the Ohio Society of Mechanical, Electrical and Steam Engineers began a two days' convention in Columbus today. The national convention of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers is now in session here and the two gatherings probably include a larger number of engineers of all kinds than have ever before been gathered in an American city.

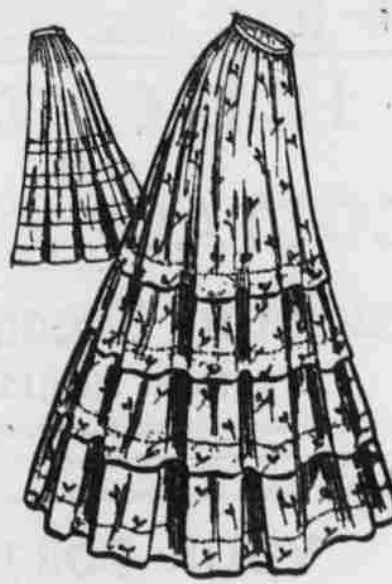
