ALL IS READY FOR BIG EXCURSION

LARGE CROWD WILL GO TO
HERMISTON MAY 27

Special Cars Will Be Attached to Regular Passenger Train Leaving Here at 8 a. m.—Trip to Reservoir Will be Made on Arrival at Hermiston—Addresses and Other Exercises in M. E. Church at 1:30 p. m.

Plans for the entertainment of the excursionists who will go from this city to Hermiston next Wednesday, May 27, are now practically complete and a most enjoyable time is anticipated. The excursion train will leave this city promptly at 8 o'clock Wednesday morning, the excursion cars being attached to the regular Portland local train which leaves at that time.

Immediately upon the arrival of the train at Hermiston the trip to the reservoir will be made and upon the return from the reservoir, at 1:30 p. m. the exercises will be held at the M. E. church, which has just been completed.

Teams from all the surrounding country will be at Hermiston to assist in taking the crowds to the reservoir and it is hoped to have plenty of teams to accommodate the crowds, no matter how large.

Everyone is urged to take lunch from this city as it will be impossible for the little town to feed the large number of excursionists.

However, a large tent will be provided for a rest room and where any one may eat lunch.

The exercises at 1:30 will consist of addresses by Hon. H. M. Cate, republican candidate for the United States senate, D. C. Henry, reclamation engineer in charge of the states of Oregon, Washington and California, John T. Whistler, engineer in charge of the department of the interior, sent out especially by Secretary Garfield.

A fine program of sports will be carried out in the afternoon, a large sum of money having been raised in Hermiston to offer in prizes, and the train will leave Hermiston on the return trip to this city at 6:45 in the evening.

Hermiston is doing everything to make the event pleasant and attractive and an immense crowd from the surrounding country is expected. All of Umatilla county will be represented, while large numbers from other eastern Oregon counties will be present to see the gates of the big project opened.

ROYAL BIRTHDAYS.

Anniversaries Will Be Celebrated in England.

London, May 23.—Wherever the British standard floats the subjects of King Edward will tomorrow pay loving tribute to the memory of his queen-mother, the great and good Victoria, whose birthday anniversary this year falls on Sunday. In London the observance commenced today and was accompanied by the usual patriotic exercises and athletic events that mark what is now called Empire Day.

Despite the popularity of King Edward among the masses of the English people, his birthday has never been marked by such exhibitions of patriotic enthusiasm as even now extends to the celebration of Victoria's natal day. Perhaps this is largely due to the conservatism of the British people, who, through a reign covering over three score years, have come to regard May 24 as a permanent holiday.

Another royal birthday will be celebrated Monday, which will be the 41st anniversary of the birth of the Princess of Wales. The princess was born May 25, 1867, the daughter of the Duke and Duchess of Teck. Her childhood was spent at White Lodge, one of the most beautiful sections of rural England. She was betrothed to the Duke of Clarence, and when his death put a tragic end to this romance of royalty, it was soon whispered that "sailor George" had won the heart and hand of the fair princess.

The marriage of George Frederick and Princess May took place in July, 1893, and their first son and heir to the title of the Prince of Wales, was born in 1894. A second son, Albert Frederick, was born in 1895, a daughter, Victoria Alexander, in 1897, and three other sons, Henry William, George Edward and John Charles, between 1900 and 1905.

The princess is a great favorite with the English people and her birthday will be marked by much public rejoicing.

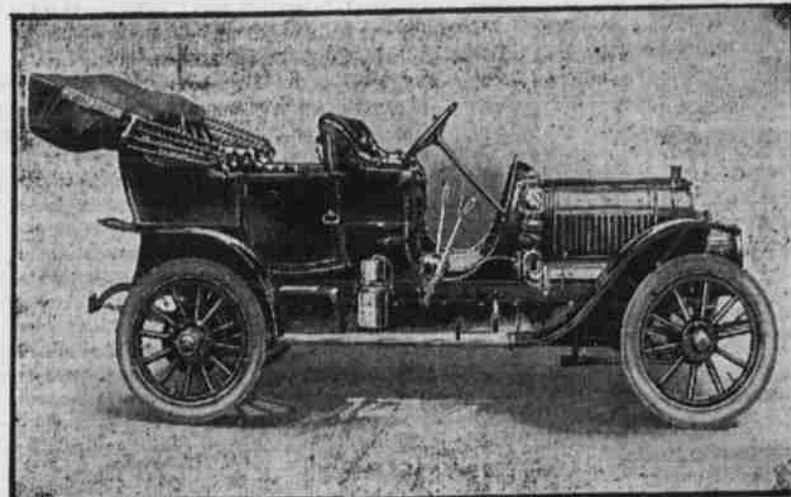
