Weston, May 27.—The thirteenth annual reunion of the Umatilla county pioneers began here today, and it will continue over until Saturday evening. The box mill turns out 6000 apple boxes per day, and many other smaller boxes in proportion. Twenty-five men are employed at the present time under the management of C. W. Avery. Thomas Yarbough, a saw mill man of 36 years' experience is mill wright and superintendent.
