GREAT CIRCUS HERE TOMORROW

WILTON LACKEYE, ACTOR, LAUDS SELLS-FLOTO SHOW

Noted Actor Tells Spokane Paper He Has Seen All the Big Shows But Never Saw a Better One Than Sells-Floato—He Says There is Something to This Circus Besides the Parade and the Band Wagons.

The following interview is taken from the Spokesman-Review: "I have seen them all—the big ones—Barnum, Ringling, Sells, Forepaugh, but I have never seen one better than Sells-Floato," said Wilton Lackeye, the actor, last night. "In this show all the goods are not in the window. After the parade and the menagerie are over there's the show. "There are two rings, two stages, hippodrome track, mid-air arena and wild west realm in the circus department of the tent. Standing in one end you can not distinguish a person in the other. It will take care of 20,000 people, I am told. Everything is so clean and new. Sawdust, plenty of it, everywhere and the ground moistened by a system of sprinkling carts. A concert band of 20 pieces furnishes the music. "The 'Yankee Doodle Dandy' tournament, a beautiful, patriotic creation presenting the entire array of performers, horses, elephants, camels, clowns and chariots, and a ballet of picked beauties is the opening number. Following is 'The Gathering of the Garlands,' dancing cotillions horseback with a wealth of roses, a favorite pastime of the Boers in South Africa. The double herd of elephants stand on their hind legs and on their heads, play musical instruments, teeter, march, waltz, maneuver, and one undresses like a person and goes

to bed. Chad Wertz turns a double somersault over the double herd of elephants, camels and horses and a pyramid of persons. Fifty males take part in the leaps. While the women bareback riders Mrs. Corriea and Mrs. Nellie Lowande, are displaying their grace and skill Spider Johnson, assisted by 29 clowns, is busy with his automobile brainstorm stunt. It is a scream. The auto used is mechanically correct for the work it does, and when it explodes spectators are holding their sides. The Ty-Bells do a high-air iron-jaw act. They have a trained dog that does what they do and concludes its burlesque by making a slide for life the length of the tent hanging by its teeth. The 'Black Hussars,' coal black stallions, appear in one ring doing a liberty and trick act, and the Ben Hur herd of Arabian stallions in the other and the Savoy on the center stake with the only trained bulldogs in the world. I think the greatest feature under a circus tent is the Goldin troupe of Russian singers and dancers. Their singing is on the grand opera order. There are the Oern family, equilibrist; Coma and Madsa, Japanese acrobats; Wolly and Piers, Roman rings; Ejska and Tots, Royal circus of Tokio, and the great Fowlers, gymnastic marvels. The wire-walking act of La Nole, Meynotte and La Nole is marvelous. Selgrist and Selgrist, clever athletes, are a great feature, turning forward double somersaults from the ground. "Children find joy in the trained ponies, geese, birds, 'Betty' Boyle and his trained mule, January; Saraswa and his trained roosters—these are a few of the many acts that interest the big audience." This show will be here tomorrow.

BALLOON MAKES LONG FLIGHT

BOYS AFTER TICKET GIVEN WORKOUT

Airship With Coveted Tag Sails Far Over High School Hill and Lands on Tutuilla—Boys Race Up Hill and Over Plowed Ground—Those Already on Hill Have Advantage—Last One Goes Up Today.

When the Sells-Floato balloon went up from the top of the East Oregonian building yesterday afternoon the small boys who took after the wind-bag were given a "workout" such as they have never had before.

Unlike the other balloons sent up by the circus people, the one liberated yesterday showed some speed as a high flyer. It rose high into the air and headed over the south end of town as though hunting for Tutuilla creek.

Not daunted by the race before them the band of boys took after the airship and they raced up the high school hill as fast as they could. But other small boys were already on the hill and consequently they had the advantage in the race.

The balloon was first reached by Donald Rader, who accordingly gets the circus ticket that was attached thereto, Harry Montecristola of the East Oregonian circulation department, was a close second, but he was handicapped by the fact that he had to climb the hill.

The last of the circus balloons will be sent up this afternoon by Lee Drake, advertising manager of the East Oregonian, and who is the official aeronaut.

BOUGHT 500 CATTLE

FIRST GRASS BEEF WILL BE SHIPPED JUNE 10

Nate Rains Purchases Fine Bunch of Fat Stuff for Seattle Markets—Shipment Comes from Five Willow Springs Growers—Price Is Not Made Public But Is Understood to Be a Little Better Than \$4.25 Per Hundred.

Nate Rains of this city, cattle buyer for the Frye-Bruhn company of Seattle, has just made the first purchase of grass beef made in this county this season, having purchased 500 head of choice cattle from Harry Whitaker, George Linsner, Fletcher Brothers, Koop Brothers and J. A. Guardian, to be shipped from this city on June 10.

The cattle have been on the range in the Willow Springs district this spring and are in excellent condition for the market and are the top choice of about 800 head which he contracted. The remainder of the purchase will be sent out about June 20.

This is the first shipment of grass cattle to be made out of eastern Oregon this spring and is another evidence of the excellent advantages of Umatilla county as a stock country. While the price is not made public, it is understood that it is a little better than \$4.25 per 100 and is satisfactory to the growers.
