Idaho Phosphates in Demand.

Joseph J. Taylor, manager of the phosphate mines of the San Francisco Chemical company, near Montpelier, is in the city to spend a few days looking after business matters in conversation with a representative of the Boise Capital News he stated that the company is shipping out about 10 carloads of phosphates each week to San Francisco, where it is manufactured into super phosphate fertilizer and shipped to Australia and to the southern part of California.

This is one of the big industries and most important enterprises in the state, on account of the large deposits of phosphate which exist near Montpelier and which are scarce throughout the west. Of conditions at the mines which have been in operation for several years and which were developed entirely by Mr. Taylor, he said: "We are quietly going ahead and sawing wood, shipping out about 35 carloads a month or on an average of 10 carloads each week to the chemical works in San Francisco, where the phosphates are manufactured into fertilizer."

"If it was not for the railroads, which have prohibitive rates on sulphuric acid, we could manufacture the fertilizer right at the plant. The rate has been cut some, about 80 cents lately, but it is still pretty high. "We are only working a small force but have been getting out 35 cars a month to the chemical factory in San Francisco. A great deal of the fertilizer manufactured from the phosphates is shipped to Australia, while some is shipped to southern California. The high freight rates have kept the prices down much lower than they would be if the mines were located closer to the coast."

To Take Walla Walla Census.

That Walla Walla will soon be a city of the first class is now practically assured, says the Walla Walla Statesman. A new census is to be taken at once and there is no doubt in the mind of any sane citizen of the Garden City but that it will show more than 20,000 inhabitants. The committee in charge of the census, Alfred Bachold and John Stack, reported at the council meeting last night that it could be taken most quickly and officially by the city mail carriers aided by a supervisor. There are nine city carriers and they will do the work for \$25 each. W. L. Cadman will supervise and compile the work for \$3.50 per day.

Candidates Must "Fess Up."

Under the new direct primary law it is necessary for every candidate, successful and unsuccessful in the primaries, to file a bill of his expenses incurred during his campaign, within 10 days after the election, says the Walla Walla Statesman. Blanks for this purpose have been mailed by City Clerk Hart to all the candidates at the primaries and the itemized statements must be forthcoming within a few days.

If the expense lists are not furnished as required by law, the offending person is liable to a fine of not less than \$25 and not more than \$100 or from 10 days to six months in the county jail.

It is thought none of the bills will show anything remarkable as the campaign was quiet and little money circulated.

To Keep Caldwell Club Alive.

A concerted effort will be made this week to put the Commercial club upon a sound financial basis, says the Caldwell News.

At the last meeting of the board of governors a committee of nine members was appointed for this purpose and a meeting was held on Friday afternoon to discuss ways and means.

It was decided that there was just two ways of raising the necessary funds, one by making an assessment and the other by selling the tickets for the building lots donated to the club. The latter was the proposition adopted. The town was divided into three sections and each section placed in charge of three men. The three committees will make their canvass simultaneously and it is expected all the tickets will be disposed of during the day.

WHEN IS AN INRIAN AN INDIAN?

Puzzling Question in Citizenship Before Federal Court.

When is an Indian not an Indian? Or rather, when can an Indian drink? Or, rather still, when can a person give or sell an Indian whiskey? This interesting question is to be decided in the United States courts in Portland within the next few days, says a Portland paper.

William McIntire, an old sailor and who claims to have come to Portland before the hills began to grow, and when there was nothing in Portland but the waterfront and the trees along its banks, and when a sky-scraper was never even thought of, was brought here this morning, having been arrested at Klamath Falls for giving whiskey to an Indian. McIntire now makes his home at Klamath Falls.

Horace G. Wilson, superintendent and disbursing agent on an Indian reservation, is the complainant. The Indian is John Gray.

It is claimed that if an Indian has had his allotment of land, taken the oath of allegiance and is not in charge of an Indian agency, that he is an American citizen and can drink as much whiskey as he likes and that it is no one's business whether it is given him, if he is lucky, or whether he purchases it at so much per swallow. But on the other hand if an Indian is a government ward, inside or out, under any circumstances.

McIntire, who is an old man, claims never to have been arrested before, and he is much grieved over his plight.
