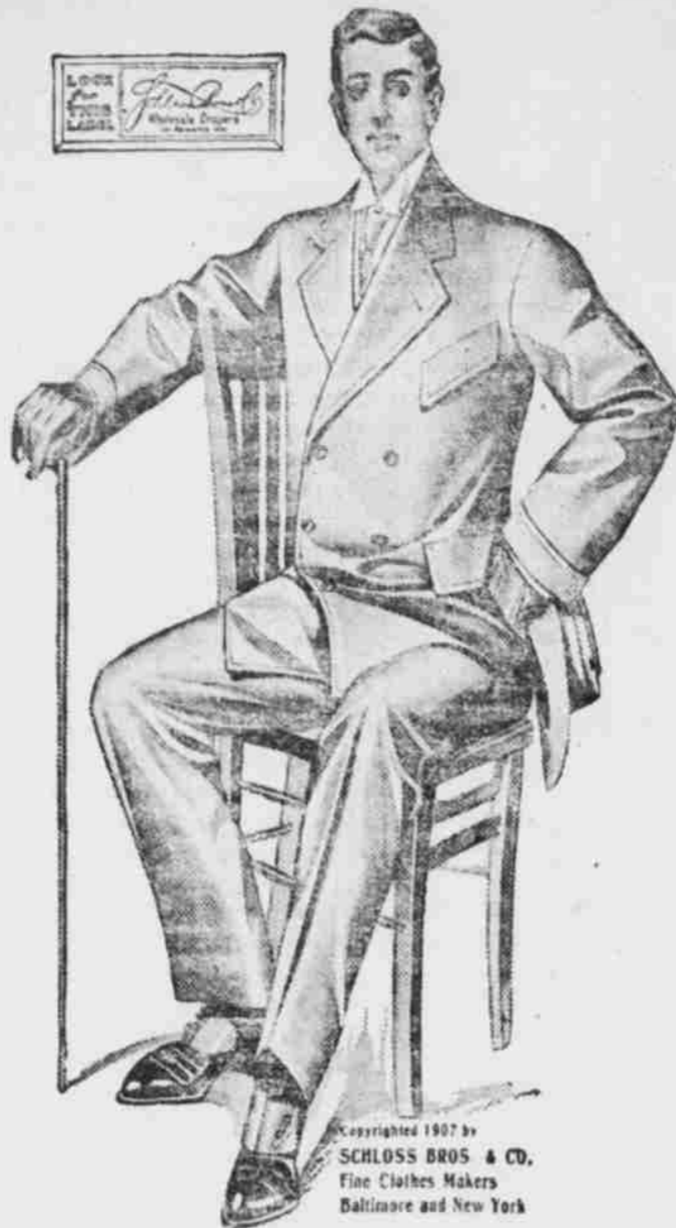

PAPER BUSINESS IS PROFITABLE

BLAKE-MCFALL COMPANY TO BUILD IN PORTLAND

Wholesale Paper Firm to Erect \$65,000 Store and Salesroom in Metropolis—Company One of the Biggest on the Coast—Need of More Room and Better Quarters Compels Improvement.

That the wholesale paper business is profitable is shown by the fact that the Blake-McFall company of Portland will erect a store room in Portland costing \$65,000. The Oregonian says of the new building:

Blake, McFall & Co. yesterday concluded a deal for the Fourth street frontage of the Dexter property. This piece is 125 feet on Fourth street, 105 on the south side of Ankeny and 101 along the line of the Marshall-Weiss company building.

The deal was affected through the agency of W. B. Streeter and the figure of which the deal was closed was a little over \$65,000. This sale was referred to in the Oregonian a few days ago as having been made for the Mercantile Investment company, who owned the half block, but at that time the purchaser's name was withheld, upon request, as future plans had not then been determined on.

Blake, McFall & Co. announce their intention to erect on the site a six or seven-story building to be occupied by the firm as a paper warehouse and salesroom, offices, etc.

With the completion of the building of the Pacific Paper company and the one now announced, the locality will become a center of that character of wholesale and retail trade, for already within a few blocks are located stationery stores and commercial printing offices, with others to be located before the close of the year.

The new building will probably cost from \$60,000 to \$70,000, judging from the cost of similar buildings of recent construction. Until the architects have reported on plans and specifications, however, a more accurate estimate cannot be made.

HONOR FOR AUSTRIA'S GOOD RULER

Vienna, Aug. 18.—A review of thousands of troops, great public festivities and the granting of amnesty to all prisoners undergoing sentence for lese majesty were among the features of the celebration of Emperor Francis Joseph. Fetes were held throughout the dual monarchy and there was great public rejoicing everywhere.

The emperor himself spent the day quietly, as his advancing age does not permit any exertion. If he lives until December 2 next, he will have reigned over Austria for 60 years, a record equaled by but few European monarchs of recent times.

Never before was the emperor's birthday so generally observed as today. Business was generally suspended and all public offices and a majority of shops and factories were closed. Gala performances were given at all theatres.

The streets and boulevards for which Vienna is famous were decorated with flags as seldom before. In nearly all churches special thanksgiving services were held and attracted thousands of worshippers. Telegraphic messages of congratulation were received by the aged emperor from nearly all the reigning monarchs of Europe.

Francis Joseph was proclaimed Emperor of Austria on the abdication of his uncle, Ferdinand I, on December 2, 1848. He was crowned King of Hungary June 8, 1867. He married in 1854 Elizabeth, daughter of Duke Maximilian of Bavaria.

Wife Was Assassinated.
She was assassinated by an anarchist at Geneva, September 19, 1898. Of the three children of the royal pair, Crown Prince Rudolf committed suicide and the two daughters, the Archduchesses Gisela and Marie,

are ineligible to the throne. On the death of Crown Prince Rudolf, in 1889, the right of succession passed to the emperor's brother, the Archduke Charles Louis, who died in 1896.

His son, the Archduke Francis Ferdinand, is the presumptive heir to the throne. He married, in 1900, the Countess Sophie Chotek, but the union was a morganatic one. The emperor has a second brother, the Archduke Louis Victor. The family is of the ancient Hapsburg line, and is inclined to look upon other European monarchies as of a mushroom royalty.

The celebration in honor of Emperor Francis Joseph are not the forced tributes of downtrodden subjects, but are spontaneous testimonies to the love and affection which this most generous monarch is held by the people.

There is no more popular ruler in the world, and he has won this popularity by a uniform generosity and kindness to his people ever since he mounted the throne more than half a century ago.

SHUTS OUT IMMIGRANTS.
Canada Has Checked Influx of Foreigners to Her Domain.

Ottawa, Ont., Aug. 18.—That the restrictions adopted by the Canadian government to prevent an influx of cheap labor from Europe and the Orient have been successful is shown by figures compiled by the immigration authorities for the first six months of this year.

During this period the number of immigrants arriving in Canada was 96,119, as compared with 169,419 during the first six months of 1907, a decrease of 43 per cent. Very few Asiatics have been admitted this year.

The immigration from the United States, largely farmers who settle in the undeveloped regions of the west, shows a slight gain, and the Canadian government is doing everything in its power to increase this class of immigration.

PRAISE FOR FOOTHILLS.
Walla Walla County's Dry Land Yields Well.

In the estimate of the wheat crop of Walla Walla county for the current year, E. W. Wright, the Portland Oregonian's expert, says it will be 4,000,000 bushels, says the Walla Walla

Union. The remark by this writer which is to the point is: "The old reliable foothill country of Walla Walla is good as usual." The fact of the matter is that the foothill sections, to the east and southeast of Walla Walla are a little better in the matter of their yields than usual and that is what is going to give the entire county such an excellent general average. Gradually, the area of the hill country in the directions mentioned, is being increased in wheat planting and the discovery is being made that the soils are not only prolific in production with a lesser rainfall than lower down, but they increase in the matter of bushel yield per acre year after year.

After the convention many of the editors will go on a junket to Winnipeg and other Manitoba towns, returning in time to attend the state fair early in September.
