FEWER TOURISTS TO ORIENT.

Financial Flurry Checked Travel to China, Japan and Philippines.
 A few days ago one of the dailies published a long article calling attention to the great crowds of tourists which were overrunning Japan and passing by the Philippines, says the Gossip of Manila.

The facts are that the financial panic in the United States seriously interfered with tourist travel to the orient this year, and the number touring Japan and China is much below the usual number, while at Nagasaki the Nagasaki hotel has been compelled to close its doors for want of patronage.

While Manila has not been visited by large numbers of tourists so far during the present year, yet there has been a considerable number who have stopped over from time to time, and as all have been well repaid for their visits, there is every indication that the tourist travel will gradually set in toward these islands and that Manila will have a fair share of this travel before many months has passed. Due in a large measure to the publicity bureau of the Merchants' association.

The United States recruiting station in Spokane is drawing the lines pretty close, and a man to gain a berth in the army of Uncle Sam, must measure up to specifications in several ways, says the Spokane Chronicle. Fifty Eight Forest Fires.

Dr. L. A. Kerr, state deputy fire warden for Stevens county, Wash., organized a force of 50 men at Colville last week and went to the little Pend Oreille lakes to fight the forest fire which has been raging there for several days. A number of homes have been destroyed, fields swept, and a tract of more than 20,000 acres of state land, covered with valuable timber, is now in danger.
