MORE MONEY FROM CORPORATIONS

IDAHO RAISES VALUES OF TELEGRAPH LINES

Attempt to Raise Valuation of Railroads to \$17,000 Per Mile Failed and a \$15,000 Per Mile Basis Was Agreed Upon—Telegraph and Telephone Lines Must Pay More.

The Boise Capital News says of the efforts of Idaho assessors to raise the value of telegraph and telephone lines and railroads:

A flat raise of 10 per cent on assessed valuations of telegraph lines, a proportionate raise on telephone lines and a raise of \$2000 per mile on assessed valuation of the Oregon Short Line, Northern Pacific and Great Northern, and a proportionate raise on branch lines and on other lines, with the exception of the Pacific & Idaho Northern, has been made by the state board of equalization over the assessed valuations on such property for 1907.

The schedules showing the actual increase in assessed valuations for 1908 have not been completed by the state auditor's office which is busily engaged in preparing these, and which expects to have them ready in the course of a few days.

A raise of \$4000 per mile in assessed valuations of railroads was desired by Governor Gooding, he making a motion that railroads be assessed at \$17,000 a mile. State Treasurer Hastings moved that railroads be assessed at \$16,000 per mile, neither of these motions receiving a second.

Railroads at \$15,000 Per Mile.

State Auditor Bragaw moved that railroads be assessed at \$15,000 per mile for 1908, and the motion was carried, Governor Gooding being the only member of the board dissenting.

Main line roads will accordingly be assessed at \$15,000 per mile, a proportionate increase in the assessed valuations of branch lines being made.

The two small roads, the Pacific & Idaho Northern and Idaho Northern, located in Canyon and Owyhee counties will be assessed at \$2300 per mile, the same as last year, it being shown that these lines have not been paying during the past year.

A flat raise of 10 per cent in assessed valuations of telegraph lines was made by the board. The schedules showing the raises made is being prepared by the state auditor, and the clerks of the office.

Telephone lines were divided into two classes in accordance with the statement made by telephone representatives to the board that some of their country lines were assessed too high last year.

Twenty Per Cent Raise.

Class A of telephone lines is assessed at \$175 per mile, while class B is assessed at \$50 a mile. A 20 per cent raise over valuations for 1907 was made on additional copper and iron wire. Cables were assessed at 10 cents per foot, which is an increase of 5 cents per foot over the assessed valuation for 1907.

The independent telephone lines are assessed at the same rate as last year, the main line being assessed at \$100 per mile for the first wire and poles.

The Interstate Telephone company, in northern Idaho, is raised from \$40 per mile for last year to \$50 per mile. The assessed valuation for 1908 which is an increase of 10 per cent is for the first wire and poles.

The Postal Telegraph is assessed at \$50 per mile for the first wire, no assessment being made for poles as the company uses the poles of other lines not maintaining any of its own. A 20 per cent increase over 1907 an all additional wires of the Postal was made by the board.
