INSURANCE SHAKEUP

SEATTLE AGENTS HAVE WRITTEN FAKE POLICIES

Premium Retained and Put in Their Own Pockets—Ships Carrying Bogus Insurance and No One Is the Wiser—No Statements Given Out.

Portland, Ore., Sept. 4.—A special dispatch from Seattle to the Oregonian, says:

Some of the most prominent insurance men in Seattle are threatened with scandal and possible prosecution according to well defined and authentic reports in circulation. It is charged that certain insurance agents have been issuing false policies of which their companies have had no knowledge, and retaining the premiums. Marine insurance has been the field in which the operations have been carried on, because the short duration of the risk makes it easy to defraud and difficult to detect, except in case of loss. The system has been to insure cargo or hull for one

trip, issuing a fake policy which contains the guarantee of a standard company to pay in case of loss, but is either a duplicate number or fake number and is never recorded on the books of the company. The agent pockets the premium and personally assumes the risk. If the insured ship makes port undamaged, no one is the wiser. If she is lost and the agent does not make good the insured ship would stand the loss unless the agent's company should pay it to save its name. Recent investigations and change of agencies have revealed several of the fake policies.

Pending investigations no public statements of the details will be made.
