THE PROHIBITION STRUGGLE IN MAINE

Augusta, Me., Sept. 14.—Whether the prohibition law, which has been on the statute books of Maine for half a century, shall be resubmitted to a vote of the people is the principal issue before the voters of the state today. Incidentally, they will elect a governor, state auditor, members of the state legislature and county officers, but interest in the success of parties or individuals has been overshadowed by the prohibition issue.

The democrats have declared against prohibition, and on a platform demanding resubmission, the party apparently has a better chance of success in today's battle of ballots than at any time since the war.

The nominee for governor of the republicans, Bert M. Fernald, of Portland, was nominated after a bitter contest. His opponent was William T. Haines of Waterville, who has been a member of both branches of the legislature, attorney general and has been very prominent in promoting enterprises and other large business ventures. Mr. Haines favored the resubmission of the constitutional amendment to a vote of the people.

Mr. Fernald was a "stand patter" on the prohibition issue, and he won out in the convention. The contest has left sore places.

not only declared in favor of prohibition, but went further and said that the party was opposed to the resubmission of the question to the people.

Would Resubmit Issue.

There are thousands of republicans who believe that this matter should be resubmitted, and the thing which is bothering the republican leaders is how these liberal republicans will vote. If they quietly cast democratic ballots the result will be an overwhelming democratic victory. The prohibitionists have a candidate for governor and have nominated several county tickets.

The democratic candidate for governor is Obadiah Gardner, a farmer, who for 16 years has been the master of the Patrons of Husbandry of Maine and prominent in the national councils of that order. He is called a good business man, is an excellent public speaker and has a personal acquaintance with thousands of the farmers in every section of the state of 15,000. It is declared that many of the republican farmers will vote for him. The democratic state platform declares in favor of resubmission and demands the repeal of the Sturgis enforcement act.

Mr. Gardner tells the people that he himself is a teetotaler, that he never drank a drop of liquor in his life but that he believes that the people should have the opportunity to vote upon resubmission and that he and his party are willing to abide by the judgment of the people. He also asks for an equalization of taxes.

Since 1832 the republicans have carried the state, except in 1894, by pluralities ranging over 20,000, the high water mark being reached in 1898, when the late Representative Leveiley Powers was elected governor by a plurality of 15,216 in a total vote of 123,516.

Democrats Made Gains.

The democratic party became demoralized and not much was done by it in the way of organization for the biennial election until 1904, when Governor Cobb, the republican candidate, was elected over Cyrus W. Davis, democrat, by a plurality of 26,516 in a total of 131,512.

Two years ago the democrats again nominated Mr. Davis, and they carried on a most aggressive campaign against Governor Cobb, one of the chief issues being the unpopularity of the Sturgis enforcement law, which had been approved by Governor Cobb.

The result of the election came near to wiping out the republican plurality. The result was: (Whole number of votes. 133,500; Cobb (rep.) 69,427; Davis (dem.) 61,363; Woodward (pro.) 11,333; Fox (sec.) 1,551; scattering, 26. Governor Cobb's plurality was only 8,064 and his majority only 5354.

This was not all. The representatives, who had been receiving plur-

alities ranging from 5000 to 7000 or more, came near being defeated. Representative Littlefield came within 1959 votes of being defeated, and the only one of the four representatives who made fairly good showing was Mr. Powers.

The democrats had more members of the state house and senate than in many years. They elected sheriffs and other officers in several counties carrying the strong republican county of Kennebec, the home of Representative Burleigh.

Since that election many things have happened to disrupt the republicans. A faction has grown up which has been opposed to what has been denominated the state house ring, over which Representative Burleigh has been charged with being boss.

REDMEN ASSEMBLE FOR BIG CONVENTION.

Bridgeport, Conn., Sept. 14.—Hundreds of tame Redmen, both bucks and squaws, swooped down upon this peaceful New England city today and are in complete possession with the full consent and approval of the pale-face citizens.

The invaders come from nearly every state and territory in the Union and are here for the purpose of holding the national convention of the Improved Order of Redmen. Three score great councils, with nearly 4500 tribes and a half million members are represented.

Reports of officials will show that considerably over a million dollars was disbursed by the order during the last year, and that nearly \$22,000,000 has been paid out in benefits since the organization of the order.

W. A. S. Bird of Topeka, is the present grand neoneohee; Joseph Farrar, of Philadelphia, the great senior sagamore; Wilson Brooks of Chicago, the great chief of records, and William Proven of Westfield, Mass., the great keeper of wampum. A spirited contest is expected for some of the national offices.
