

HERMISTON'S SCHOOL OPENS

ATTENDANCE LARGE
IN NEW BUILDING

Concrete Block Structure Costing \$8,000 Completed During Summer and Now Opened to Scholars—Excellent Teaching Corps Secured—Colonist Visit Project—Fruit Grower's Union Seeks Uniformity—Light Plan Welcomed.

Hermiston, Sept. 22.—School opened in Hermiston yesterday, over a hundred pupils enrolling in the five rooms of the new \$8000 concrete block building which was erected for that purpose during the past summer. The outlook for educational work in the coming year is exceptionally bright.

The school is in charge of Prof. F. R. Pennock, formerly of Milton, Miss Bertha Randall will teach the high-school grades, Mrs. B. G. Monkman those of the grammar rooms, Miss Jessie Williams the intermediate, and Mrs. W. G. Rodda the primary grades. The enrollment showed a considerable increase in the school population of Hermiston during the summer months and was a great contrast to the opening of school two years ago when but 18 pupils were entered in the various classes.

The new building is a handsome structure of concrete blocks, well finished throughout and fitted with modern heating and plumbing.

Land sales have been active the past week. Colonist travel from the east to Oregon is bearing fruit in peopling the Hermiston valley.

Slowly the fruitgrowers' union under President Dishon, is getting order out of chaos and is accomplishing its end in securing a uniformity of planting among the settlers. At the meeting Saturday evening the settlers planned for the planting of many thousands of trees.

ZION WILL PURIFY THAT DEAR OLD CHICAGO TOWN.

Chicago, Sept. 22.—A visitation from the hosts of Zion City is to "purify Chicago" which was branded "rotten as hell" by the Zion leader yesterday.

Wilbur Glenn Voliva, successor to John Alexander Dowie, came to town as one of the strangers into Sodom yesterday, and announced the militant host would march on the city the latter part of October.

Voliva's proposed invasion of Chicago will rival Dowie's famous visitation from the hosts of Zion City. He plans to bring a host of 1000 to the storming of Chicago's stronghold of vice. With banners streaming, hands playing sacred music and hymns swelling from the long ranks, the "soldiers of the Lord" will march from Zion City to Chicago.

By this missionary descent upon the city, Voliva hopes to add several thousand members to the church of Zion. Voliva's caustic words were directed at Judge Landis of the U. S. court, and against John Hatley, former receiver of Zion City.

To more than 1000 persons he told of the invasion he had planned against sinful Chicago. In his attack upon the ministers, Voliva said they were shunning the truth and that when he came he would expose them.

BISCUIT FOR HORSES LATEST GERMAN FOOD.

Consul Henry H. Morgan of Amsterdam, reports upon a tabloid horse bread which is attracting much attention in Europe and for which many high qualities are claimed by the patentee, from whom the consul has received the following information:

Its intrinsic worth in phosphoric acid and chalk, in vegetable forms, is more than double that contained in ordinary oats and hay. The following is the daily feed of a horse in Holland: Oats, 13 pounds; hay, 6.6 pounds; straw, 8.8 pounds; total, 28.4 pounds. The nutritive substances contained in the foregoing are as follows: Albumen, 1.52 pounds; fat, 0.64 pounds; starch flour, 11.46 pounds; phosphoric acid and chalk, 0.25 pounds. The same nutritive substances contained in 24 pounds of horse bread are as follows: Albumen, 2.95 pounds; fat, 0.73 pounds; starch flour, 11.86 pounds; phosphoric acid and chalk, 0.27 pounds.

APPEAL TO COMMISSION FOR REASONABLE RATES

Salem, Sept. 21.—Representative Jones of Polk county today filed two complaints with the Oregon railroad commission asking a hearing to substantiate the charges of alleged excessive rates made against the Pacific and Wells Fargo express companies. Jones declares the rates are unreasonable and unlawful and wants the commission to adjust them.

Poisoned at Conference.

Wenatchee, Wash., Sept. 21.—Poisoned by something he ate while in this city in attendance at the conference of the Methodist Episcopal church, Rev. L. K. Rufus, pastor of the church at The Dalles, Ore., died yesterday in the local hospital following an operation.

STARTED FIRES IN THE UMATILLA RESERVE.

Canyon City, Sept. 21.—Charged with deliberately setting fires in the Umatilla forest reserve on two separate occasions, Toile Spray is fleeing toward Canada with Forest Supervisor Thomas E. Chidsey and one of his rangers in close pursuit. The United States district attorney and the United States marshal may have undertaken to assist in the capture. It is said Spray cannot escape conviction and that he has little chance of getting away.

Spray is charged with setting the first fire August 29, but owing to its discovery before it had gathered great headway, the farmers and forest rangers were able to control it before much damage had been inflicted. Spray had made several incautious statements concerning the origin of the fire and he was thereafter closely watched. When he went into the reserve September 2 the rangers were close behind him but he succeeded in starting a blaze which spread over five or six sections of timber land before it could be subdued.

Spray is a cowboy who has used the range covered by the Umatilla forest reserve for a great many years, and it is said he has bitterly opposed the control of the grazing privilege by the government, as well as the settlement of the country, which has progressed rapidly during the season. He has been at enmity with the settlers and has caused them many annoyances, resulting in the attempt to burn them out.

If convicted the penalty which the court can inflict is a fine of not more than \$5000 and imprisonment for not more than two years, or both. The value of the timber destroyed by the conflagrations started by Spray is about \$7000.

METHOD SCHOOL OPENS FOR BANK EXAMINERS.

Washington, Sept. 21.—At the call of Lawrence O. Murray, comptroller of the currency, the bank examiners of the east assembled today at the treasury department for a conference on methods.

It is believed that the recent Pittsburgh incident, in which an examiner, alleged to have been intoxicated, closed a solvent bank, has aroused the treasury department authorities. The announced purpose of the meeting is to bring about closer co-operation between the comptroller's office and the examiners than has heretofore existed, and at the same time to establish a uniform method for the guidance of bank officials and examiners.

Under the present arrangement the examiners work to a large degree independently of one another, and each follows his own method of examination and procedure. A well defined system will be adopted at the meeting, when the most capable and experienced examiners will be called on to outline the plan.

Mr. Murray feels that the general efficiency of bank examinations can be raised to a much higher standard after closer communication has been established between the treasury and its employees in the field. He purposes to call a meeting of western bank examiners toward the end of September in Chicago.
