"THE CAT AND THE FIDDLE"
NEXT BIG ATTRACTION.

"The Cat and the Fiddle," the merry musical extravaganza of the present season, will be presented at the new Oregon theater Friday, October 9.

As the title indicates, the play tells of the wonderful doings of the people of another world in connection with some of those of our own flesh and blood. The motif of the story is this: In a far-away island the Island of Eye, the great Eye rules over the destinies of the people. The nominal king, Great Gobs, and his consort, Queen Circe, are the rulers so long as the Eye is kept open, but every 100 years a sacrifice, in the guise of a young girl with a strawberry mark on her left arm, has to be offered as a token for the continuance of the reign of the Eye. Unless the sacrifice is offered, the Eye closes and Great Gobs and Queen Circe lose their power and the Genil, with the Cat and the Fiddle, who have been imprisoned in a jar in the bowels of the Catskill mountains for 600 years, are restored to the throne.

The play opens with Great Gobs and Circe finding the girl Polly, in the vicinity of Kokomo, Ind. While Polly, her lover (Wilfred) and their friends are on a cruise the ship drifts towards the Island of Eye. The wishing ray from the eye beams on the ship—the villain wishes the vessel to sink and all are washed ashore, or rather into the sea.

The second act opens with every one saved and on the Isle of Eye. Great Gobs and Circe relentlessly keep up their search for Polly, but are foiled by her friends. In the meantime, Happy, a tramp, finds the jar of the Genil, breaks it open and releases the Genil and the Cat and the Fiddle; whereupon the Genil becomes his slave forever and any wish Happy may ask is granted, providing the Cat and the Fiddle are present.

The last act finds Polly in the power of Great Gobs, who is to offer her as a sacrifice to the Eye, which is almost closed. He is about to triumph notwithstanding the efforts of her friends to release her, when the Cat and the Fiddle, Happy and the Genil appear on the scene. The Eye closes forever, Gobs and Circe are dethroned, and the Genil and the Cat and the Fiddle come into power again. Happy wishes that he, Polly Wilfred, Mike, Hans and the rest of the mortals be transported back to America, whereupon they all sail skyward, homeward bound, leaving the Cat and the Fiddle and the beautiful Genil in full power as absolute rulers of the Island of Eye.

WOULD TRY AGAIN FOR WHITE HOUSE

LONGWORTH TELLS OF
ROOSEVELT'S DESIRE

Son Nick's Utterance of Plan to Bring
Teddy Back to White House for
Eight Years After Taft Has Had
His Term Considered Greatest Tac-
tical Blunder of Present Campaign
—Predicted He Will Be Remem-
bered With Burchard.

Chicago, Oct. 5.—The utterance of Congressman Longworth, son-in-law of President Roosevelt, that Taft should be kept eight years in the White house and then Roosevelt should be elected in 1916, to remain president two terms, supplied the sensation for today. His speech at Sterling, Ill., has caused Longworth to be dubbed generally by politicians "the Burchard of the Taft campaign." Opinions naturally have varied as to the significance of the statement. Some say Nick has let out a state secret which will enrage many republican politicians and cause the alienation of a large support, and that he has merely let the cat out of the bag. John E. Lamb, in charge of Democratic headquarters, said: "There is evidence that Longworth has let slip an intimation of plans actually laid. It explains the president's anxiety to get Taft nominated, and the present fight he is making, by using the machinery of the federal government, to force his election. The president is talked off for United States senator from New York. If chosen his term would end almost exactly in eight years. Such an outcome would give Roosevelt and Taft between them practically 24 years, or a quarter of a century, in control of the government."

"It is apparent that Longworth has become the Burchard of this campaign for the republicans."

Chroniclers have recalled that once before "Nick" revealed state secrets for which he was roundly scolded by the president. When at Manila he gave out an interview saying the president might accept renomination. Later it developed that the president had used that threat to force Taft's nomination, really meaning it, serving notice on certain opponents of Taft to that effect.

The most noticeable feature of the discussion is that Taft's partisans resent Longworth's utterance, as tying them up too closely with Roosevelt.

WOULD TAKE CENSUS OF WORLD'S WATER POWER

In connection with the preparation of a report for the conservation commission recently appointed by the president, the United States geological survey has undertaken to make a complete census of the water powers of the country, including data as to the amount of power that is now developed on the various streams and the prominent streams and the amount available for future utilization.

A somewhat similar work was undertaken in 1889 in connection with the tenth census of the United States as a result of which two volumes on the subject, one relating to streams east of the Mississippi and the other to western streams were published. Since the preparation of that report an immense amount of formation in regard to surface water resources in various parts of the country has been collected by the United States geological survey, and this information, embodied in the survey records, serves as a basis for the present census.

The work of preparing the census is divided among nine hydrographic districts, each under the charge of a district engineer, who, with a corps of trained assistants, devotes his entire time to studying the conditions affecting stream flow in the group of states assigned to him.

FLASHED LANTERN IN FACE AND MAKES GOOD ESCAPE.

Tacoma, Oct. 5.—A burglar ransacked Irving House, south C street, Saturday and fought in the darkness with D. B. Cook, the proprietor, who was seriously cut. The burglar escaped with \$60 belonging to a roomer, after flashing the dark lantern in Cook's face.

MOLTEN METAL DESTROYS RAILROAD SHOPMEN

Chicago, Oct. 5.—One man killed, two fatally injured, and a score burned seriously when a ladle containing tons of molten metal was overturned in the shops of the Grand Trunk railroad Saturday. The metal engulfed the workmen and some were frightfully burned.
