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A MODEL FARM.

West Texas Stockman Starts Ideal Ranch of 2200 Acres.

Rowland, Ore., Oct. 9.—Among the many people coming to this part of the Willamette Valley to make their home is a wealthy family from western Texas—that of Colonel Rose. Colonel Rose, who was for many years engaged in the cattle business in the Lone Star state, has purchased the Teal & Coleman ranch in the foothills of the Cascades, near here and about 12 miles south of Brownsville, and is there erecting a beautiful and comfortable home, together with as fine a complement of ranch buildings as can be found anywhere in the state. The Teal & Coleman ranch consists of 2200 acres of land, a portion of it being in the valley, the rest running up into the Cascades, and the entire body being one of the best tracts for stock raising purposes in western Oregon.

A beautiful farm house is now being erected on the ranch. The house will have all modern conveniences and will be the equal of the best in the cities of the state. A complete water system will be established, the water to be supplied by a small stream tumbling down from the mountains and running through the ranch. This same stream will also furnish the power for a small electric power and light plant and the ranch house will, as well as the other buildings of the vast stock farm, be lighted by electricity.

Extensive farm buildings, such as horse and stock barns sufficient to house large herds of the stock are planned, and will be erected immediately, and the owner expects to engage extensively in the raising of blooded stock, being thoroughly familiar with the business after the many years spent in the same line in Texas and other states.

It is proposed to make the old Teal & Coleman ranch one of the model stock ranches of the state, and the stock shows of the state fair at Salem and the Country club at Portland may in future years find some of their best prize winners to be the products of this ranch.

Progress on Power Line.

Walter Pierce reports that the poles for the power line to connect the Grande Ronde electric system with the Baker line, have been set for one-half the distance out from Union, says the La Grande Star. At present rate of progress all the poles will be in by the end of next week and it is the expectation of the company to have the wires strung about one week later. In fact, Mr. Pierce believes that they will have everything in readiness to connect up by the first of November. This connection will give the Grande Ronde company an additional 2000 horse-power if that amount is needed. There is a force of about 50 men employed on the work.

HILL ROAD TO HEAD OFF RIVAL

RACE FOR CENTRAL WASHINGTON WHEAT

Proposed Feeder of North Bank Line Will Take Big Shipments to Port of Portland Instead of to the Puget Sound Cities—Proposed Route Begins at Kennewick.

Work on the survey of a line to connect the North Bank and Great Northern roads by way of the Columbia river has been begun by a party of Hill engineers, and the line will not only head off a projected Milwaukee branch through Douglas county, Wash., but will bring the vast wheat crop of Douglas and Benton counties down the water grade to Portland, says the Portland Journal.

The route of the proposed line begins at Kennewick, on the North Bank main line between Spokane and Portland, follows the west bank of the Columbia to Priest Rapids, where it crosses the river and follows the east bank of the Columbia to Trinidad on the transcontinental line of the Great Northern. At Trinidad the proposed line will connect with a route already surveyed by Great Northern engineers to connect Trinidad with Waterville, by way of Moses coulee.

Report Substantiated.

The Waterville line was surveyed a dozen years ago, but was given up without commencing construction work. It has recently been surveyed, however, and the beginning of the new Kennewick-Trinidad line survey lends color to the report that the entire line will be built at once.

The construction of the line would be of especial importance to Portland, because it would divert all the wheat of central Washington which the Milwaukee road has been preparing to capture for Puget sound, to Portland, down the Columbia river grade. The new Columbia river line would give Hill a down haul from Waterville, in northern Douglas county, to the sea, making it practically impossible for roads running to the sound to compete with him in the hauling of wheat. Freight rates on wheat are so low that the expense of hauling up grade across the Cascade divide would prove too much for the Milwaukee.

Feeders North and South.

Last summer a survey was run by the Great Northern from Adrian, in Douglas county, paralleling the Milwaukee line to Othello and running due south from there to Pasco. If this line as well as the proposed Kennewick-Trinidad line is built the North Bank will have feeders on each side of the Columbia which will practically shut out the Milwaukee from securing any of the central Washington wheat shipments.
