LAST SPIKE DRIVEN ON WALLOWA EXTENSION

The laying of the track to Joseph, the Wallowa county terminus of the O. R. & N. extension, was completed yesterday, says the La Grande Star. There is work for about two days more for the tracklaying gang in the way of putting down sidings and a "Y." When this is done the only thing which remains is that of leveling up and ballasting the roadbed and then the regular train service over the entire extension will begin.

Under the present plans and arrangements the regular service will begin Monday, November 16. It is reported that the first through train to Joseph will leave La Grande the Saturday before and will lay over at Joseph until Monday. On the latter date trains will begin running in both directions and the service will then be duly inaugurated. There will be for the present a mixed train each way daily between La Grande and Joseph.

INDIAN LAND AT OROFINO SOLD.

Weyerhaeuser Syndicate is Purchaser of Large Tract.

Orofino, Idaho, Nov. 6.—The sale of a large tract of Indian land adjacent to the present townsite insures the growth of Orofino, for with the land in possession of white owners clear title can be given to purchasers. Jerome J. Day of Moscow purchased 50 acres of this land, while the Clearwater Timper company, the Weyerhaeuser syndicate, purchased a large tract. The real reason for these purchases is not known, but it is regarded as significant and indicates that Orofino will be the central point when the Clearwater timber is being milled and marketed.

Local property owners have been anxiously waiting for some announcement in regard to the proposed plans of the Weyerhaeuser syndicate, for it is believed that the timber will be milled near Orofino. The buying of land adjoining the townsite is regarded as important, and if it becomes known that the Weyerhaeuser syndicate will build a mill near Orofino activity in real estate is expected.

LOWELL WOMAN SLEEPS FOR WEEKS AT A TIME.

Lowell, Mass., Nov. 6.—Miss Louisa Piotta, who has at various times astonished physicians by her long slumbers, is again asleep. She has not been awake for five days. Her last long sleep was from June 5 to June 29, and on various other occasions she had slept from one to three weeks without waking. Physicians are at a loss to explain the cause of the peculiar malady. Miss Piotta seems to suffer no ill effects from her long sleeps, and when she awakes is under the impression that she has slept but a single night.

CUBANS' FIRST PRESIDENT BURIED WITH HONORS.

Havana, Cuba, Nov. 6.—The funeral of Tomaso Palma, formerly president of Cuba, was held here this afternoon. He was given elaborate military and state honors. The cortege was followed by throngs of sorrowing people.

Portland, Ore., Nov. 6.—United States Commissioner Cannon has under advisement the evidence submitted in the preliminary examination of Charles A. Straus, the suspended cashier of the Portland postoffice, charged with a shortage of over \$4000. Whether the case will go before the next federal grand jury will be announced Tuesday.

Increase Per Capita.

Canadian textile workers have decided that the weekly contributions should be increased from eight to 25 cents a week, and that representation should be made to the government in such a way that the law stating that women and children should not be allowed to work over 55 hours a week should be enforced.

STANDARD OIL CASES INDEFINITELY POSTPONED

New York, Nov. 6.—It was announced from the offices of the Standard Oil company today that word has been received from United States District Attorney Randolph of Memphis, that the federal suits against the Standard Oil company of Indiana, scheduled for trial November 9 at Jackson, Tenn., would be continued indefinitely. It is unlikely the cases will be heard until after the present term of the federal court in Tennessee, which will be concluded early in April.

STREET CAR ACCIDENT IN CITY OF PORTLAND

Portland, Nov. 6.—Scores of passengers were cut by glass and other things injured early today when two cars collided in a dense fog on Twenty-sixth and Clinton streets. Men were hurled from platforms of both cars and others were thrown against the windows, shattering them. Women were trampled upon in the aisles.

Baby Is Scalded to Death.

The 3-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. G. N. Crabtree, near Scio, Ore., died Thursday, as a result of burns sustained from falling into a tub of boiling water while the mother was doing the family washing, Monday.

Grand Rapids, Mich.—"Grandma" Truesdale, an inmate of the county house, celebrated her 193d birthday. She is extraordinarily bright and shook hands with everybody. There is no doubt as to her birth. The Prince of Wales, now King Edward, stopped at her house in Chicago when he was touring the country. Her father once owned a large part of Chicago but lost it all.
