NEARLY 70 AT RELIGIOUS MEETINGS OF INDIANS

Another Delegation Arrives to Attend the Indian Services on Umatilla Reservation-Sioux Elder and Indian Misisonaries Come From Montana-Full Day of Meetings Planned for Tomorrow-Evenings Devoted to Temperance,

(Special Correspondence.)

Tutullia Mission, May 3.-Delegates ontinue to arrive to attend the evancelistic conference at Tutullia which brings the total number in attendance up to about 70. Among those present were two from Poplar, Mont., one a full blood Sloux elder and the white missionary, Rev. E. J. Lindsey, who has been among the Sioux people for 19 years and speaks their language. A wave of interest went over all on their arrival and more so when each of these strangers spoke. Their different language added to the number already spoken in and about the

The meeting Friday night was a raiy in the interest of the Christian Endeavor work. There were a number of short and earnest talks in several languages, but all were interpreted so that all could understand. The meeting did not break up till 12:10 a. m., but during all that time there was not a lull in the meeting or the interest

Five united with the society, but these were mostly from the visiting people. They unite here and desire to return nome after the meeting's to their churches and reservations to organize Christian Endeavor work

The different services all day Sunday were of considerable interest. They began at 9 a. m. Following the morning sermon the new convertawere baptized and then the Lord's Supper celebrated, and an offering for benevolent purposes. The Sunday school began at 2 p. m., followed by the usual prayer meeting or experience meeting at which time a sharp ear could hear a number of different languages, as all Christians took some part in testimony, song and prayer.

Sabbath evening was given to the cause of temperance, and any of the talks would do justice to any temperance campaign could they have been understood by white barbarians. For to the Indian as to the old Roman, all who do not know his language are barbarians. These people call the Stoux Indians the "Cut Throats," and the Sloux in turn called them the "Pierce Nose," an equally bad name. But now they meet together in Christian conference, as the Sloux elder said last night, "Clothed in their right mind," at the feet of Jesus Christ, because His gospel made known to both has made it all different.

Today at 2 p. m. the C. E. society has announced a social to which all are invited. And on Tuesday there will be held a joint session meeting of ministers and ciders to arrange for future meetings on the northwest reservation.
