





Strangulation might have been the direct cause of death, but Professor Ferguson has established the fact that the young missionary worker was under the influence of a powerful drug at the time she was strangled



The law itself carries no penalty, but there may be . provision making it a misdemeanor for the violation of it." From the fact that the gown would not be a part of his regular raiment, Judge McCredle holds that it is unfair for the state to cause him the expense.


