TARIFF FIGHT ON

(By John E. Lathrop.) Washington.-The fight over the member of the "lumber lobby" who has been here since the tariff discussion began has admitted that it was largely a "tempest in a teapot," so far as the duty on rough lumber was concerned. The real essence of the stiff fight put up by the lumber interests on this schedule was inspired by fear that the demand for free lumber would be so strong that both rough and dressed grades would be placed on the free list.

"We are satisfied with the outcome of the lumber schedule in the bill as it emerged from the conference committee," he said. "We are not hurt at all, and will continue to command the market as we have in the past."

The real concern of the lumbermen was over the duties on dressed grades, as little Canadian rough lumber is shipped any distance from the Canadian border, owing to the poor economy of paying freight on the shavings which are cut off when the lumber is dressed.
