WHEAT AND CORN MARKETS ARE HIGHER

Sharp Advances in Chicago—Broomhall Reports Damage in Argentina.

Liverpool.—Broomhall has the following cable: "Buenos Ayres, Argentina, Dec. 10.—Weather throughout the harvest district is very hot. The damage to corn is general and heavy." Chicago, Dec. 10.—December was the only option to show a gain at the opening of the market this morning, the initial price being 1-4c higher than yesterday. Others were unchanged. Closing was 1-4c to 5-8c advanced over yesterday, with May the principal gainer. Corn was the principal market here today, owing to the damage report which came in from Argentina. Opening was 1-8c to 3-8c higher, and the closing 1-2c to 1 1-2c advanced. Oats market followed the lead of the trading in corn and today's closing was 5-8c to 1 1-8c above yesterday's final figures. Provisions showed sharp advances, owing to the high price of hogs in the yards. Advance in pork was aided by the sharp rise in corn. January closed 5c higher, while the May was 55c above the last price of yesterday. Lard values followed the pork, January advancing 15c. Foreign wheat markets were higher. Liverpool opened 1-4d above yesterday. Minneapolis advises this morning were to the effect that the mills there were paying 3c over the December for cash No. 1 northern this morning. Demand is very heavy. Cash sales—Wheat—No. 2 red, \$1.23@1.24; No. 3 red, \$1.15@1.20; No. 2 hard winter, \$1.11-1.20@1.12 1/2; No. 3 hard winter, \$1.06@1.10; No. 1 northern spring, \$1.12@1.13; No. 2 northern spring, \$1.09@1.12; No. 3 northern spring, \$1.06@1.10-1.2. PENDLETON MAN RECEIVES HIGH PRICE FOR SWINE

Portland Union Stockyards, Stockdale, Dec. 10.—While there is a very liberal demand for extra good stuff, the market is sluggish for poor stuff and values are being depressed as much as possible. Hog market advanced to \$8.50 late yesterday afternoon with two sales at the high record. H. M. Adams of Pendleton, was one of the lucky ones to receive the highest price for swine on the recent movement. He shipped in 80 head that brought \$8.50. They averaged 225 pounds and were very select stuff. "They were very fine hogs," said S. P. Gould, who sold them in the yard. "Mr. Adams is the man, it will be remembered, who had those very wild steers in the yards last spring. They were so wild that the trade was afraid to go near them." Only Good Cattle Are Sought. Depression is shown in the cattle market for ordinary arrivals, and prices obtained may be considered a fraction lower. Killers are filled up with ordinary stuff, and are not seeking any more. They are still in the market, however, for real good quality and are still willing to pay the high price listed. Cows 60M in the yards during the 24 hours as high as \$3.65, but more could have been obtained if the quality had been shown. A heavy bull sold in the yards today at \$2.50. It averaged 1790 pounds. Sheep and Lambs Are Firm. Intense firmness is shown in the market for both sheep and lambs. Today lambs of quality were readily taken hold of by killers at \$6, and the demand is increasing. Today's run of livestock compares with this day in recent years as follows:

Those Who Supply the Market. R. M. Adams, the Pendleton shipper, topped the hog market at \$8.50 today. Ed Richmond of McCoy brought in two loads of sheep. S. W. Williams was another man in with a load of goats. He brought a car from Junction City. The following is the general range of livestock values in the yards: Cattle—Best steers, weighing 1200 pounds, \$4.75; medium steers, \$4.50; best cows, \$3.75; fancy heifers, \$3.75 @ 3.85; medium cows, \$3; bulls, \$2 @ 2.75; stags, \$2.50 @ 3. Hogs—Best east of the mountains, \$8.50; fancy, \$8.25 @ 8.40; stockers, \$5.50 @ 6; pigs, \$6 @ 7. Sheep—Best wethers, \$5; ordinary, \$4.75; spring lambs, \$6; straight ewes, \$4.25 @ 4.50; mixed lots, \$4.25 @ 4.50. Calves—Best, \$5 @ 5.25; ordinary, \$3 @ 4.50.

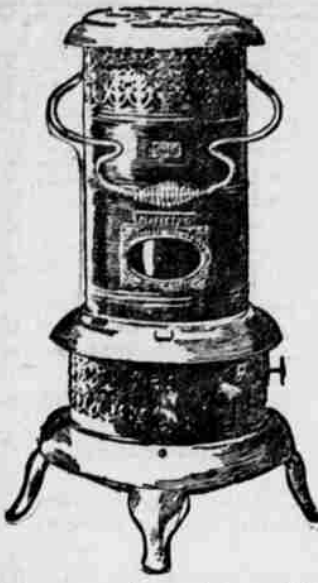
