Stick Leather Chairs.

If leather in chair seats sticks to the clothing, sponge with a mixture of ether and alcohol, dampening the cloth slightly and following it by wiping off with a clean flannel dampened with pure chloroform. The varnish was badly done, or it would not stick.

Cooking Over Fish.

To use cold halibut or other fish, remove the bones and flake it and arrange it in layers, with bread crumbs and seasoning in a buttered baking dish. Cover the top with buttered crumbs, turn in hot milk to moisten sufficiently, sprinkle grated cheese over and bake.

Beef Broth With Barley.

This soup may be recommended where soup is intended as the principal course and may be rendered very nourishing and satisfying when small cubes of beef, carrots, turnips, leeks, celery and barley are added and cooked in the beef broth until tender. The round, slim pieces are the best to use for a rich beef broth.

Buns.

Break one egg into a cup and fill with sweet milk; mix with it half cup yeast, half cup butter or lard, one cup sugar, enough flour to make a soft dough, flavor with nutmeg. Let it rise till very light then mold into small biscuits with a few currents. Let rise second time until double the bulk, then bake, and when nearly done glaze with a little molasses and milk. Better than doughnuts.

On Kissing.

Savory Chicken.

Cook three and one-half table-spoonfuls butter with one teaspoonful finely chopped onion, till yellow, stirring constantly to prevent burning; add one table-spoonful of corn starch and stir until well blended; turn on gradually while stirring constantly one and one-half cupfuls chicken stock; bring to the boiling point and add one and one-half table-spoonfuls lemon juice, three-fourths of a table-spoonful salt, one eighth teaspoonful paprika, one-half cup celery cut into small bits, and one and one-half cupfuls chopped chicken. Garnish with toast points and parsley. Serve very hot.

Nut Crisp.

Sift slowly one-half cup of hominy grits into one pint of boiling water; remove to the back of the range and simmer for an hour; then all one cup of finely chopped English walnuts; turn into pound baking powder cans and set away to cool. When firm turn out, cut into half-inch slices; dredge slightly with flour and fry until crisp and brown. Place overlapping on hot platter.

Gleanings.

Boil vinegar in the fish skillet or pan to destroy the fish odor.

Comforts and quilts should be dried in a good, stiff breeze, so that they may be light and fluffy as when new.

A spoonful of oxgall to a gallon of water will set the colors of almost any goods soaked in it previous to washing.

If your rugs curl up at the edges they can be made to lie flat by dampening the curled edge and pressing with a hot iron.

The improved pie pan has a blade fashioned to the center, which revolves around the bottom of the dish beneath the pie crust when the end protruding from the side of the dish is moved.

Indian Hash.

Chop sufficient cold roasted turkey, duck or chicken to make a pint. Cut a good sized onion into very thin slices. Pare, core and chop fine one apple. Put two table-spoonfuls of butter in a saucepan, add the apple and onion; toast until brown, then add not more than one-eighth of a teaspoon of powdered mace, a half teaspoonful of salt, a teaspoon of curry powder, a table-spoonful of flour, a teaspoon of sugar, mix and add half a pint of stock or water; now add the meat; stir constantly until smoking hot, then stand over hot water; covering closely for twenty minutes. Add two table-spoonfuls of lemon juice and serve in a border of boiled, well-seasoned rice.

Crumpets.

Scald one pint of milk; dissolve in it one scant teaspoonful of salt and two table-spoonfuls of butter, and pour into a bowl. When lukewarm add one-half yeast cake, dissolved in two table-spoonfuls of warm water and sufficient sifted flour to make a thin drop batter. Beat hard for five minutes, set the bowl in a pan of hot water, cover with a cloth and set aside in a warm place to rise. When very light fill a well-greased hot griddle with greased rings (the regular crumpet ring about twice the size of a muffin ring). Pour rings two-

thirds full and set the griddle where the crumpets will color on the underside in about eight minutes. Turn when brown on the other side, slip off the rings and serve on a warm plate. They may also be torn open, spread with butter and slightly toasted before serving.

Southern Cake.

Here is a South Carolina recipe for this cake, deservedly a favorite in all Southern dining rooms long before Mr. Owen Wister heaped drawing-room honors upon it.

Two-thirds of a cupful of butter, five eggs, two cupfuls of sugar, four cupfuls of flour, one-half cupful of rich milk, two level teaspoonfuls of cream of tartar and one level teaspoonful of soda. Cream half the sugar with the butter, beat the remaining sugar into the yolks of the eggs and sift the cream of tartar and the soda twice through the flour; beat the eggs and sugar together with the butter and sugar; add the milk slowly and finally beat in the flour and stiffly-beaten whites of the eggs. Flavor half this mixture with rose, and into the other half beat one teaspoonful of powdered cinnamon, one teaspoonful of powdered cloves, and one grated nutmeg, and flavor with vanilla, lemon or almond; bake in four layer-cake pans—two white layers and two spiced layers.

For the filling: Cut fine one cupful of seeded raisins, shred thin half a citron melon, grate one small coconut and blanch three-fourths of a pound of almonds; make an ordinary boiled icing, and into it beat all these ingredients save the almonds. Put the mixture thickly between the layers, and finish the top layer—which should be a white one—with sprinkled powdered sugar and the almonds stuck in porcupine-wise. The measuring cups are ordinary coffee cups and are filled just level. This is a successful recipe and one easily followed.

HOUSE WILL PROBE BALLINGER'S AFFAIRS

Washington, Dec. 17.—The sensational attack upon Secretary of the Interior Ballinger made upon the floor of the house yesterday by Representative Hitchcock of Nebraska, makes it practically certain that the house organization cannot stave off an investigation of the general land office until after Christmas. The general sentiment in the house today is that there should be a full investigation of the charges brought against the secretary by L. R. Glavis, former chief of the field division of the land office in connection with the Alaskan coal fields. A resolution demanding such an investigation is now in the hands of the committee having been referred to that body by Speaker Cannon.

Secretary Ballinger has been spending much time in the White House recently. When asked today if President Taft is preparing his forthcoming message on conservation, Ballinger said: "We haven't reached that yet." When asked about the attack made on him by Representative Hitchcock, Ballinger said: "The charges are all fabrications from beginning to end. Besides, he is a democrat."
