HOGS HAVE REACHED HIGH TIDE IN YARDS

GOOD QUALITY ADDS TO MARKET STRENGTH

High Class Stuff Arriving in Portland Yards—\$8.75 Is Still Quoted—No Change in Cattle Prices—Sheep On Very Good Basis.

Portland Union Stockyards, Dec. 20.—There was a good showing of hogs over Sunday but the market absorbed all that came and continues to quote the record price, \$8.75 as reported on Saturday.

While it may be possible for the trade to squeeze a fractional advance out of the hog market for something extra select, the trade in general is of the opinion that the top has about been reached for the present movement.

Fact that eastern prices have receded recently gives rise to this thought of the local trade, for the Portland market can go no higher than the basis of eastern shipments, except during extra-ordinary times such as a famine or some accident which would hold back supplies while all interests were empty.

Better Class of Hogs Coming. To the credit of local shippers it should be mentioned here in great letters that they are sending forth to the Stockdale yards a better class of hogs than has heretofore been received here as a rule. This is the reason why buyers are willing to overtop recent prices—they want for it.

According to some of the leading buyers they would not be compelled to send east for their packing hogs if the local market could give them the many advantages as their requirements demand and the same quality as has recently been received here.

Today's run of hogs was 597 head. It compares with 523 Saturday, 75 Friday, 404 Thursday, 20 Wednesday, 536 Tuesday and 557 head a week ago today.

A year ago today hog arrivals were 179 head, with the market just about steady at unchanged values.

Cattle Carried Over. Very liberal arrivals of cattle at a late hour Saturday forced many of the receivers to carry over a good portion of their supplies until today's market. While only a small run of cattle was reported in the yards up to 11 o'clock, more was expected during the day. However, with the carry over from Saturday, there were about 30 cars offering for sale this morning.

As a rule there was no change in cattle prices during the day. One thing that helped the trade to maintain prices was the fact that a very large per cent of the arrivals were of good quality. Had they been poor a lower level would have been likely. The local market does not want poor cattle at this time.

There was no run of calves in the yard's today; in fact none have arrived since Thursday, when only a nominal supply came forward. Therefore the market is good at former quotations.

A year ago today cattle arrivals were 325 head. Market was firm with no change in prices.

Good Showing of Sheep Prices. Moderate run of sheep was shown in the yards over Sunday. In this branch of the Stockdale yards, trade remains on a very good basis and for lambs the general range is around \$6. Good wethers range around \$5 @ \$5.25, but it takes quality to bring the latter figure. Ewes are selling around \$4.50 @ \$4.75, the latter for select.

A year ago today sheep arrivals were 1034 head, but the liberal run did not in any way affect the high prices in effect at that time.

Hogs—Best east of the mountains, \$8.75; fancy, \$8.65; stockers, \$6; pigs, \$6 @ \$7.

Sheep—Best wethers, \$5 @ \$5.25; ordinary, \$5; spring lambs, \$6; straight ewes, \$4.75; mixed lots, \$4.75 @ \$5.

Calves—Best, \$5.25 @ \$5.50; ordinary, \$3 @ \$4.50.

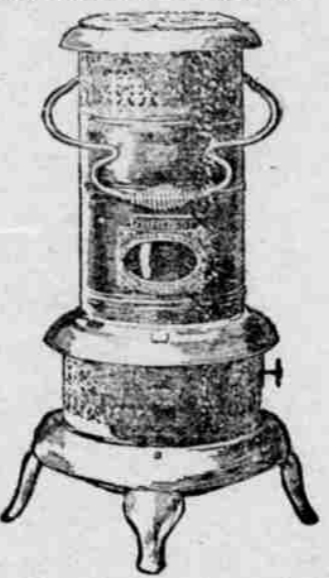
