Young Employe Had Piece of Board Thrust Through Bony-Company Settles For \$6,000 Besides Paying for Medical Treatment.

A dispatch from La Grande says: Jas. Gavin, an engineer of the O. & N. company, is home from the hespital in Portland voere he has been confined for over a year following injuries in an accident at the tock yards in the western part of own. Just before his release from the hospital the railroad company settled all claims for damages arisng from the accident by the payment to Mr. Gavin of the sum of \$6,-000. A further part of the stipulation is the agreement on one part of the company to pay all the expense incurred for medical treatment and hospital charges during the long perlod of the young engineer's confine-

Mr. Gavin was the engineer on a train which started out for the west and at the stock yards there was a car which did not "clear" the main The engine crashed into the car and a piece of board split from the side of the car was thrust through the lower portion of the engineer's body. He was removed to the hos pital and has been at the institution for a period of nearly fourteen months.
