DEPOSED PREACHER SUES HIS DEFAMERS

WAS DRIVEN FROM HIS PARSONAGE AT COLFAX

Ousted Pastor and Wife Would Collect \$101,500 Damages from Men Who Drove Him from His Post.

Spokane, Wash., Jan. 11.—Rev. Herbert G. Buss, deposed pastor of First Baptist church of Colfax, Wash., and his wife, Virginia A. Buss, now residents of Kansas City, Mo., have instituted an action for \$101,500 damages in the United States circuit court here against F. M. English and 12 prominent residents of Colfax. It is charged that the defendants conspired with trustees of the church to defame the character of Buss and his wife, also assaulting and ousting them from their parsonage, compelling them to defend themselves from unwarranted arrests and criminal actions, abrogating a contract with the church, and, finally, forcing their departure from the state of Washington on account of the scandal and reproach heaped upon them.

Colonel William H. Plummer, who appears as counsel for Buss, says the complainant was regularly ordained a minister of the gospel of the Baptist church on November 12, 1905, and has since then and is now engaged in church work. He was called to First Baptist church at Colfax on November 10, 1908, and served until the latter part of May, 1909. A clash came on June 7, 1909, when English and others, acting in conjunction with the trustees of the church, adopted resolutions to discredit their pastor, also making statements that he was not fit to preach, that he is not an ordained minister of the gospel and could not legally perform the ceremony of marriage, also declaring that he is a faker.

It is also charged that Buss was attacked and dragged from his home on June 7 in the presence of his family and friends and threatened with great bodily harm after being beaten and bruised; and that, to save himself and his wife from continued attack, he was compelled to call police officers to disperse the mob, of which, it is alleged, the defendants were members.

AIRSHIPS INTEREST ASTOR

American Millionaire Finances Experiments in Aeroplanes.

Paris.—Colonel John Jacob Astor does not permit the many things on his mind to keep him from keeping up with the latest developments in aviation. Colonel Astor is perhaps one of the most posted men on aeroplanes in the world, and has several experts in France now at work experimenting along lines laid down by himself, which will take aeroplanes out of the plane of sports and make the airship a commercial actuality. Colonel Astor's experiments are being made with the gyroscope as the best means to secure automatic stability to the airship, with magnesium metals to cut down the weight of the ship and

to get more lifting power and with auxiliary motors to get increased power and greater safety.

It is understood that the American multi-millionaire intends when he has got the right kind of an airship to go in for polar explorations and if the expedition of Captain Scott to the south pole is delayed it is not at all impossible that to him or at least to an air expedition backed by him will go the honor of discovering the south pole.
