It is charged that the defendants conspired with trustees of the church to de-fame the character of Buss and his vife, also assaulting and ousting them from their parsonage, compelling them to defend themselves from unwarranted arrests and criminal acns, abrogating a contract with the church, and, finally, forcing their departure from the state of Washington n account of the scandal and creach heaped upon them,

Colonel William H. Plummer, wno appears as counsel for Buss, says the omplainant was regularly ordained a minister of the gospel of the Baptist church on November 12, 1905 and has since then and is now engaged in church work. He was called to First Baptist church at Colfax on November 10, 1908, and served until the latter part of May, 1909. A clash came on June 7, 1909, when English and others, acting in conjunction with the trustees of the church, adopted resolutions to discredit their pastor, also making statements that he was not fit to preach, that he is not an ordained minister of the goa pel and could not legally perform the ity eremony of marriage, also declaring hat he is a faker.
