LOCAL ANGLERS ARE STILL ON WARPATH

ENGINEER NEWELL ROUSES IRE BY CONTRADICTIONS

Tells Secretary Ballinger that Pendleton Fishermen Exaggerated Report of Destruction of Trout and That the Feed Canal Was Screened—Affidavits Will Be Sent to Washington.

That the Umatilla County Anglers' association will have some further effort to make before the destruction of trout on the Umatilla reclamation project is completely stopped is indicated by late letters which have been received by Attorney Charles H. Carter from Senator Chamberlain, by President G. I. Dow from Secretary of the Interior Ballinger and by Secretary C. K. Cranston, from Congressman W. R. Ellis.

It seems that when the complaint of the local anglers reached Washington that orders were immediately issued to Engineer Newell in charge of the project to properly screen the feed canal. Then, according to recent letters from Washington, Engineer Newell reported back to his superiors in Washington, that the canal was screened and had been, that the reports of the amount of fish destroyed were greatly exaggerated and that there are nine other ditches not

screened and which must destroy more fish than the government ditch.

Venue of Anglers in Question.

The members of the local anglers' association are therefore not very well pleased that the truth of their statements has been contradicted and affidavits are now being prepared in substantiation of their allegations and these will be forwarded to Washington to contradict the reports of Engineer Newell. They say they are not going out after the scalp of the engineer who is proving himself such an enemy to the fishing interests, but that if he chooses deliberately to risk his official head that they are not to blame. They are working in the interest of good fishing and they propose to see that Mr. Newell, or his successor, is compelled to conform to the requirements of the state law.

Statements Regarded As Absurd.

His explanation of the presence of the fish in the reservoir and on the fields is evidently that they made their way into the reservoir when small enough to pass through a half inch screen and in the few months that they were in there, grew to be from 10 to 20 inches long. This explanation is declared by the fishermen to be no more absurd than the excuse that the government should not be compelled to screen because private ditch owners may not have screened. They say the government should be the very last to point to any one else as an excuse for its failure to obey the law.

They also cite the fact that when the ditch wall gave way last spring that hundreds of fine trout were found in it. These full sized trout went directly from the river into the ditch for the reason that trout get back into the feed canal and that

once in the reservoir cannot possibly they could not have been in the feed canal more than a few weeks.

Affidavits are being prepared which will show that the feed canal was not screened as reported by Engineer Newell, that the reports of the destruction of fish were not exaggerated and that there are not "nine other ditches of considerable size" not screened.

The following is the letter from Senator Chamberlain, including a copy of a letter received by him from Secretary Ballinger:

Chamberlain's Letter, United States Senate, Washington, D. C., December 31, 1909.

Charles H. Carter, Esq., American National Bank Building, Pendleton, Oregon.

My Dear Sir:

With further reference to your letter of the 16th instant, the secretary of the Interior advises me today that he has investigated the matter of the alleged destruction of fish in connection with the government feed canal in Umatilla county, Oregon, against which I have heretofore protested, and he states as follows:

"Complaints of this kind have been received and report conditions have been obtained from the field.

"I am informed that a half-inch screen was provided for the feed canal over a year ago, and efforts were made to maintain this, but the amount of leaves and other trash traveling in the water was so great that it clogged the screen to such an extent that it was impracticable to keep it open and the safety of the canal was threatened by overflowing above the screen. For this reason it was removed and a screen of a different pattern, more easily cleaned, but containing half inch openings, was provided at the beginning of the present season and has been since maintained.

"I am advised that the amount of fish destroyed is not as great as reported, and that the cause of complaint has been removed. I am informed also that there are nine other ditches of considerable size, besides a number of smaller ones, taking water from the Umatilla river, and so far as this office is advised, none of these ditches maintain fish screens and have not been required to do so, although any fish passing through

these ditches must of course pass out upon the land and die. The aggregate destruction by the other ditches must be greatly in excess of that over the government ditch, not only on account of their greater number but from the fact that many of them carry water for a much longer period, due to prior appropriation.

"I will have careful inspection made of the headworks of the Umatilla feed canal and if proper provision is not now made to prevent the entrance of fish the appropriate parties will be instructed to make such a provision immediately.

I sincerely trust that the "inspection" which the secretary says he will cause to be made will result in some action on the part of the Interior department looking to relieve the conditions which now exist and about which you complain.
