## M'KAY RESIDENT HAS BAD ACCIDENT

GEORGE ADAMS THROWN FROM WAGON ON HEAD

Wagon Tips Over, Throwing 14m and Herder in Gulch—Two Lay Inconscious for Some Time—Other Notes From Upper McKay.

(Special Correspondence.)

McKay, Ore., Jan. 21.—George Adams has again met with a serious accident. Last Saturday afternoon as he and a herder came down Sunnig gulch they found the road they were on had been cut out by the melting snow. In attempting to turn out the heavy load carried them over and both men fell heavily on their heads. When they came to their senses it was after dark. As the herder's bedding was found the men passed as comfortable a night as possible. Evidently the rig righted itself, for an Indian who knew them found the team and looked them up in the morning.

Mr. Adams was a terrible sight. His face, head and clothes were covered with clotted blood and dirt and one ear torn to shreds. It took an hour to loosen the blood and dirt. Dr. Henderson was telephoned for and took eight stitches in the cut in the scalp. This is the second accident of this kind to befall Mr. Adams. About two years ago he fell on his head on the pavement in Pendleton. At last accounts he was in great pain.

#### REPORTS ON MINING.

Washington Inspection Presents Statistics on State Mining in State.

Spokane, Wash.—F. Cushing Moore, state mine inspector of Idaho, will say in his forthcoming annual report that the mineral production in that state amounted to \$15,650,000 in 1909, a gain of about \$250,000 over 1908. These figures do not include the output of the many smaller properties or placers. There were 19 fatalities of a total of 6099 men employed, the rate being 3.33 per thousand men, believed to be a remarkable showing. Mr. Moore says the producing mines have been able to operate regardless of financial conditions, but that the smaller ones, suffered because of the existing low merit prices, also that prospects were held back for the lack of capital, due to the financial depression of 1907. However, he adds, conditions have improved greatly during the last six months and the coming year gives promise of being one of the most successful in the history of mining operations in the state. Mr. Moore raps the "wildcat" mine promoter, who is held responsible for idle mines and mills.

SPOKANE OFFICE LOST NO REGISTERED MAIL IN 1909

Spokane, Wash.—W. P. Edris, postmaster of Spokane, says in his annual

report of the registry department that of 77,650 pieces of registered mail handled by his department in 1909 not a letter was reported missing. Four pieces were lost in 1908. Registered mail of an aggregate value of \$426,826 was handled in 1909. Registered mail of an aggregate value of \$426,826 was handled in 1909, as against \$256,715 in 1908, a gain of 65.7 per cent, while the increase since 1900 is placed at 353.8 per cent. More than 17,889 pieces of registered mail were received in 1909, a gain of 15.4 per cent over 1908. The business of the sale of stamps and post cards amounted to \$424,000 in 1909, a gain of 24 per cent over the year before. Mr. Edris says that the increases in the business of the postoffice is the best indication of the gains in commercial and industrial lines, adding that a relative increase would show Spokane to have a population of about 140,000 at the beginning of 1910, as against 121,500 at the close of 1909.

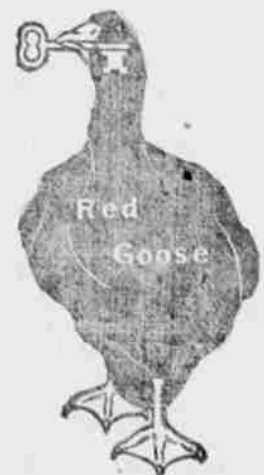
