## BOY IS RESCUED BY HIS BABY BROTHER

### 1 YEAR OLD TOT AT NOLIN IS A HERO

Clarence Weltzin Aged 7, Falls Head First Into a Barrel of Vitrol Water and is Pulled Out by His Little Brother—Other News of Nolin.

Nolin, Feb. 3.—Clarence Weltzin, 7 year old son of Henry Weltzin who lives 2 miles north of Nolin, had a narrow escape from drowning in a barrel half filled with a solution of blue vitrol water last Saturday while attempting to reach a piece of ice to eat. The barrel being buried half way into the ground the little fellow lost his balance, went in head first and was immediately pulled out by his 4 year old brother, which is considered a remarkable feat for a child of his age. There were no evil effects from his douche except that he was quite sick for a short while.

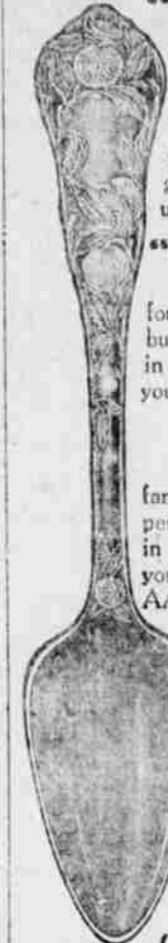

## BOY WORTH \$300,000 KIDNAPPED BY HIS KIN

El Paso, Texas, Feb. 3.—Detective C. H. Taylor of San Francisco is on his way home today with L. B. Adams, Adams' 8-year-old son John, and the boy's nurse, Nora McLaughlin. The nurse and Adams' private secretary, Nat Murphy, are alleged to have kidnaped the boy from his mother and to have brought him to this city.

John Adams is said to be heir to about \$300,000, left him by a relative of his mother. The custody of the boy was granted his mother when she applied for a divorce from Adams. The final decree has not been issued. On January 26, while on his way to school, John disappeared. Detective Taylor was detailed to find him, which he did after following Private Secretary Murphy to this city.

The three were taken to the police station, where they went into consultation with an attorney they had called. Taylor was in possession of a bench warrant for them, and they decided to return to San Francisco without making a fight on extradition.

## REPUBLICANS REVISE THEIR OLD PROGRAM

### FACTIONS JOIN TO ASSIST TAFT POLICIES

Cannon Fight Temporarily Forgotten That Party May Live Up to Protection Platform—Much Important Legislation Ahead.

Washington, Feb. 3.—The administration program, as revised today by leaders of the senate and house and given the stamp of white house approval, comprises the following legislation:

Statehood for Arizona and New Mexico in the form of a senate bill which provides for ratification by congress of the constitutions of the new states after approval by the president.

Postal savings banks with safeguards against funds being transferred from sections where originally deposited to the money centers.

Giving the president authority to withdraw from entry public lands desired for conservation purposes or for classification, the withdrawals to remain in force until revoked by him or by acts of congress.

Federal incorporation open to the

Voluntary application of concerns engaged in interstate business and willing to subscribe to federal regulation.

Creating a court of commerce and amending the interstate commerce act as provided by the Townsend-Elkins bill.

Creating a legislative council for Alaska, members to be appointed by the president.

Later in the session it may be decided to make additions to the administration program by adding measures now deemed of secondary importance. For instance, President Taft has told his advisers that he is inclined to come out strongly for ship subsidy in some form, and it is possible he also may urge the passage of the bill providing for certificates of indebtedness to the amount of \$30,000,000 to provide money to carry on reclamation work.

Aldrich Comes to Point. All republican members of the senate committee on finance had a meeting early yesterday in advance of the regular session. Some plain talk was indulged in by Chairman Aldrich over the situation in which the republican party has found itself by reason of opposition to certain platform pledges endorsed equivocally by Mr. Taft in his campaign speeches and on trips over the country since he became president.

It was stated that the president has the situation in the house well in hand, and that republicans, regulars and "insurgents" alike, have agreed to put their shoulders to the wheel and roll the Taft policies through

that body. Assurances were given that there would be no conflict between "insurgents" and the rules committee. This would be avoided, it was said, by caucuses to be held to design new machinery where any is found to be necessary for the passage of administration bills.

In return for this concession to the "insurgents" it was stated that Mr. Taft had promised that the "insurgents" would not permit their antipathy for Speaker Cannon to interfere with the program.
