New Creamery in Operation.
The Jensen creamery, located in the Pendleton Ice & Coal Storage building near the O. R. & N. depot, is now in operation. It is receiving the butter fat and transforming it into butter for distribution. The product is being put out under the name of the "Blanchard Butter."

Athena-Pendleton Academy.
At the Commercial association gymnasium Friday evening a "double header" basketball game will be played between the Athena high school and the Pendleton academy. The boys and girls teams of each institution will participate and the games are being looked forward to with much interest.

Redmen Have Clambake.
Members of the local tribe of Redmen and a few representatives of the Echo and Umatilla tribes participated in their annual celebration in the Eagle-Woodman building last evening. Aside from the feast of clams there was a very interesting musical and literary program, making the evening one long to be remembered.

Bankers' Committee to Meet.
W. L. Thompson, president of the American National bank, will leave tomorrow for Portland. He is going down to attend a meeting of the executive committee of the state bankers' association, being a member of that committee. The session is to be held to set the time and place for the holding of this year's convention of the association.

Indian Ponies Suffering.
That the ponies upon the reservation are suffering from the storm is stated by George A. Robbins who was here yesterday from his ranch on Upper McKay. According to Mr. Robbins he passed a dying pony while en route to the city and he fears quite a few of the animals have perished during the cold weather.
