Reference Case Installed.

Baseball Fans Will Meet.
A meeting of the local baseball fans and players will be held this evening in the parlors of the Commercial association for the purpose of perfecting the local organization. Officers will be chosen and delegates named to the league meeting to be held in this city Friday evening.

Telephones on Trains.
The Northern Pacific has installed telephones on both the passenger and freight trains of the Pendleton-Pasco branch. By means of these the trains will be able to communicate with the head office in Pasco in case they should be stalled between stations. Much time can thus be saved.

Will Hear Appeal Next Week.
County School Superintendent Welles has set Saturday, March 19, as the day for hearing the appeal from the election recently held in school district No. 67. There have been two warring factions in the district for several months and the defeated faction in the recent election filed a protest. The victors filed an answer and now the case will be heard and decided upon its merits.

Grain in Good Condition.
County Judge Gilliland, who returned last evening from a visit to his farm on Steward creek, says he never saw grain in better condition in that vicinity at this time of the year. There have been seasons when it was taller, but never when it was in such a healthy condition or the stand so good. He says the seed sprouted in fine shape and that not a bit of it was frozen out.

Funeral of Hazel Howland.
In the presence of a large number of friends and relatives the remains of Hazel Howland were laid at rest in Olney cemetery this afternoon. Prior to the service at the cemetery a service was held at the Church of the Redeemer by Rev. Charles Quinney. The pall bearers at the funeral were chosen from among the fellow high school students of the dead girl. They were Harvey McDill, Nat Kimball, Cleo Straughan, Lyman Rice, Cecil Cole and Jewel Rorke.

Sues for Divorce.
A suit for divorce was filed this morning by Mrs. Mary Frances McCubbins against Alfred McCubbins. These people both lived at Stanfield until a few weeks ago, when the husband is said to have deserted his family. Cruel and inhuman treatment as well as desertion are alleged as grounds for legal separation. The parties to the complaint were married at Dayton, Washington, in 1892, and have five children, ranging in age from 8 to 17 years.

Boy Has "Sleeping Sickness."
The 4-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. M. Moran has been ill of a mysterious disease at the home of his parents in the west end of the railroad yards since Sunday evening. He ate a quantity of candy Sunday and since that time has been in a comatose condition. He has not been asleep all the time but he has been in a stupor and at times has been difficult to arouse him sufficiently to give him medicine. The physician attributes the condition of the boy to the candy which he does not think was good and which evidently contained some kind of poison. It cannot yet be determined whether or not the illness will terminate fatally.

To Ascend Mt. McKinley.
Seattle, Wash., March 9.—Advisers from Alaska state that the Tom Lloyd expedition for the ascent of Mt. McKinley will begin the actual climb this week or early next. The party left Fairbanks last December and established a base of supplies preparatory to the effort to reach the summit. If the project is successful, it is expected to establish the truth or falsity of Dr. Cook's claim of having reached the top of the mountain.

The trip, while not exactly in the nature of a wager, was undertaken by Lloyd, an old-time miner, to prove that it is practical. W. H. McPhee and Dave Petree, two well known Fairbankers, have put up \$5000 that some member of the Lloyd party will reach the summit of Mount McKinley before July 4.

The members of the party are Tom Lloyd, Robert Horn, W. R. Taylor, Charles McGonigle, C. E. Davidson and William Lloyd. The latter, however, will not participate in the actual climb.

A Fifth Avenue importer, who received his last big consignment from Paris today, says spring hats are smaller, with higher crowns, and summer hats are to be larger with lower crowns.

Early spring indications point to a revival of the epoch romantic toward the 1830 period—influenced by the beauty and richness of the ancient cashmere shawls, so much admired by the belle dames of that time. The tendency to vivid colorings of the Orient, India and Egypt, and the far east, has already been noted, and the employment in abundance of flowers characteristic of these colorings gives a brilliant effect to the spring hats.

FRANCE FEARS INVASION.

Loss of Prestige in Naval Circles Worries Parisian Diplomats.

Paris.—France has definitely renounced her ambition to figure among the great navies of the world. The naval program adopted by the government is a program of renunciation, that is the argument of the "blue-water school."

Exclusive of the ships employed on distant stations, France has only 24 units to put in line of battle. Whereas, formerly, she occupied the second rank among the nations, she has now descended to fourth rank and presently, no doubt, will fall to the fifth, immediately after Japan, so that she will be definitely relegated to head the list of second class navies of the world.

Meanwhile Germany is consenting to enormous sacrifices at the bidding of the emperor. The result, the French experts insist, is deplorable. It means that in a future war, if England remained neutral, the Germans could land a force at Havre and proceed to the attack of Paris by the Seine valley, as well as meeting the troops of France on the eastern frontier.

Mme Anna Rogstad, the first woman member of the storting, which is the lower house of the Norwegian parliament, was a teacher in one of the primary grades of the public schools in Christiania when elected.
