Total arrivals of livestock in the Portland yards during the past 24 hours were but one carload of hogs, 97 head. These came from Shaniko. Out of the lot \$2 sold at \$11 per hundred pounds and 15 head went at \$9.50. The latter were simply feeders and therefore Shaniko not only broke all American prices for finished hogs but likewise secured way above anything heretofore secured for fed swine

All Lines Are Very Firm.

All lines of livestock are very firm in the Portland yards and the scant supplies indicate that not only will present values be continued for some time but there is a probability of still higher values. However, until actual sales are made none can say what the market here will reach.

Sale of cows at \$5.50, reported yesterday, indicated an advance even above \$6.25 for steers for cows generally sell at a reduction of \$1 from the price of the former. However, quality counts.

SUN TEMPLE DISCOVERED.

Prof. Garstang Makes Find on Site of Ancient Merot.

Cairo .-- Professor Garstang has dis overed on the site of the ancient Merot, the later capital of the Ethiplan monarchs, a sun temple by Ergamones, mentioned by Diodorus, The temple is a unique structure showing Greek inspiration, and containing sculptures representing King Ergamenes' victories and a triumphal procession. The building includes a sanctuary lined with brilliantly enameled tiles.
