

EXTRA GOOD HOGS SELL AT PREMIUM

ONE LOT OF SELECT
STUFF GOES AT \$11

General Market Is Weak Because of
Eastern Slump, But Fancy Quality
Brings Out Higher Range Again.

Portland Union Stockyards, April 20.—While the general market for hogs was very weak and depressed and bidders said that \$10.25 would be the best figure available, one lot of extra select hogs sold at \$11 per hundred pounds today, but this was of exceptional quality and would at any price bring a premium over the general market value.

Today's run of livestock was very small although there was a fair run of sheep.

Sheep market is down 50 cents again today and one lot of yearling lambs from North Yakima sold at \$5.50. The stock averaged 68 pounds.

THE WHEAT MARKET

PATTEN SELLS MILLION
BUSHELS OF WHEAT

Big Leader Dumps July Option in
Chicago and Causes Early Loss of
7-8 to 1 3-8c; Closing is at a Rise.

Chicago, April 20.—Even when Patten sold in the aggregate of 1,000,000 bushels of July wheat today it failed to cause more than temporary weakness in options, and, after opening severely lower, the wheat market closed 1-8 to 1-4 a bushel above yesterday.

There was alarm among the trade today when it became known positively that the former big bull leader of the wheat pit was an enormous seller of the July option. To some this gave the impression that the market was in very poor shape, and opening values were therefore bumped to the extent of 7-8 to 1 2-8 a bushel, with the heaviest loss in the May and the smallest in July.

Only a market that was extremely oversold could have acted so bullish after such a severe spell of weakness as today, and when the trade began to take this view of the situation there was instant response by prices.

Liverpool was very weak all day today, and this gave the trade at home some of its early scare. The market there opened 5-8 to 3-4 lower, and closed 1 1-8 to 1 3-4 under yesterday.

CLOSEST \$5 STATION WILL BE 100 FEET FROM RING

San Francisco.—The number of feet from the ropes at the Jeffries-Johnson battle will determine the number of dollars that will be paid out by the good sports who attend the show. Fifty dollar seats are the first prize, class A seats. They will be box seats and there are to be 1000 of them. They will extend back 45 feet from the ring. There will be an equal number of \$40 and \$35 seats, so that the nearest \$30 seats will be about 60 feet from the edge of the ring.

There will be a few rows of them only and then will come the \$25 seats, which promises to be the popular priced ones. They will begin not more than 75 feet from the ring.

Then the \$20 seats get into the game and the \$5 seats will not let the holder get closer than 100 feet from the place where the battering is taking place.
