Paris.—Professional aviators at present have their eyes on Brussels. One of the early summer attractions at the great "White City" in Brussels, which was opened today by the king of the Belgians, will be a number of aeronautic competitions, in which many famous flying men are expected to take part. Prizes of the value of \$50,000 have been promised.  
Erected on the fringe of the forest of Soignes, and skirted in one part of the giant beeches of the famous Bois de la Cambre, the exhibition grounds is one of the most picturesque sites in all Belgium and covers about 200 acres.  
Every nation has its own building, the principal being the Palais d'Industrie, which contains the chief Belgium exhibits. One of the most beautiful buildings will be the Dutch pavilion, a structure in the Renaissance style, with a belfry set in the midst of roses and tulip gardens.  
In addition to the aeronautical competitions there will be Marathon races open to all nations, swimming races, cycle and motor contests, international football and cricket matches.

**WELLESLEY GIRLS WIN FIGHT FOR TROUSERS**

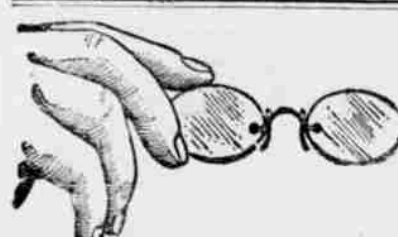
