## NEWS OF THE NORTHWEST

**Canning Asparagus.**  
Eugene, Ore.—George A. Dorris has 14 people at work at his cannery putting up asparagus. The crew is preserving about a ton each day.

**Will Build School.**  
Dallas, Ore.—The Dallas school directors will accept plans for the \$4,000 school building next Saturday. A site will be selected within the next few days.

**Lewiston Plans Display.**  
Lewiston, Idaho.—Great preparations are being made by the Lewiston Commercial club for an exhibition of Lewiston Valley apples at the National Apple show at Spokane, and the succeeding show to be held in Chicago following the next fall.

**Library Building at Bend.**  
Bend, Ore.—The Bena Fownsite company will erect a building for the local library. The new library building will probably be 20x40 feet. The main room will be about 30 feet long and there will be a smaller room at the rear for storing fuel and for packing.

**Building at Ellensburg.**  
Ellensburg, Wash.—G. A. Knox began Tuesday morning the erection of a one-story building on Pine street between Third and Fourth. A contract with Maurice Turner was signed Monday. The building will be 60x100 feet. It will contain two store rooms and an office, and will be thoroughly modern. It is to be completed in June. The cost is estimated at \$10,000.

**Oil Well 2650 Feet Deep.**  
Ontario, Ore.—Work is progressing on the Ontario oil well rapidly. It has now attained a depth of 2650 feet, the deepest oil or gas well in the west, outside of the California oil fields. A six inch casing has been put into the bottom. The drill is now in a shale formation which grows harder with depth. This is considered a very promising indication by experienced oil men. The oil indications are growing better daily.

**Grants Pass Appeals to Carnegie.**  
Grants Pass, Ore.—All preliminary plans have been made and much work done toward securing a \$25,000 Carnegie library for Grants Pass. The movement is in the hands of the ladies' auxiliary of the Grants Pass Commercial club. The ladies are practically assured of the appropriation from the library fund of the steel king, and all that is necessary for the receipt of the money is the co-operation of the city council and citizens. Several mass meetings have been held, which were well attended, and enthusiasm is at high ebb concerning the matter.

**Railroad Work Expected.**  
Husum, Wash.—Field Engineer Bahizer, who made the survey of the Columbia River and Mount Adams Railroad up the White Salmon River last fall, was here Saturday in the interest of the proposed line. He was accompanied by a representative of the Seattle, Portland and Spokane railroad, and several water power sites were investigated between this point and the Trout Lake region. They also interviewed ranchers where right-of-way is yet to be secured, leaving the general impression that the railroad company expects to commence operations within a short time.

**Boise Project Financed.**  
Boise, Idaho.—Word has reached Boise that the Bruneau project, 600,000 acres, also known as the west end Twin Falls extension, has been financed by Frank H. Buhl, Archie Milner, son of the late S. B. Milner, and others who have become associated with them in this tremendously important Carey act undertaking, the estimated cost of which is \$20,000,000. The financing of the enterprise has been turned over to the Public Securities company of New Jersey, which is understood to have been organized by Mr. Buhl for the purpose. An announcement issued by the Public Securities company mentions the financiers interested. It is stated Boise will be the headquarters of this project.

Guler, Wash.—A local improvement road will be built from Maryhill to the Coffield ranch on the Columbia river, this county, and will connect with the state road now under course of construction along that river. The road will be six miles in length, will cost \$35,200, and will be built of cement and rock.

The contract for building it has been awarded to N. D. Miller, who expects to construct a model road.
