Commenting on the situation in the senate at this time the Oregonian

"President Taft and his supporters in legislation have turned from insurgents to democrats for support for the administration railroad bill. This is natural and logical action. There can be no effective harmony between sensible conservatives and radical extremists of the insurgent stripe, There is common interest, however, between the anti-radical interests of democratic and republican parties; in fact there is a natural bond of interest between them.

"Old issues that divide citizenship into republican and democratic parties have diminished in potency to such extent that evidently they control neither party any longer. The conflict now, as represented in congress, is not so much between the old parties as between extremists who fight for noisy innovation and uncompromising radicalism and "safe and sane" opponents of these efforts."

But if time has eliminated the old issues that divide the democratic and republican parties why continue those parties. Why wear the old clothes if they have ceased to fit? Why not form a progressive and a conservative party?
